




History of PAN BORNEO INTER-CLUB MEETING

The Pan Borneo Inter-Clubs Meet started in 1984 as an intercity meet for the Rotary Clubs in Kuching, Sibu and Miri in Sarawak, East Malaysia, which were then under Rotary International District 330 Group 11. As these clubs are geographically far apart and were not easily accessible, the concept of an intercity meet was proposed by the Rotary Club of Kuching, which was then under the leadership of President Kang Tee Yong, in response to Ri President Carlos Canseco's theme of "Discover A New World Of Service".

The intercity meet would alleviate the difficulties being experienced by the three clubs coming together to exchange ideas and would also permit closer ties to be formed between them. Prior to this, the only time the clubs made contacts was when visiting Rotarians from one of the clubs attend the Rotary meetings of another club.

The objectives of the Pan Borneo Inter Club Meet are as follows:

- To provide opportunities for Rotarians in the Pan Borneo region to meet and have fellowship;
- To exchange ideas on all aspects of the Rotary movement;
- To identify a project that could be jointly undertaken by clubs in Brunei Darussalam, Sabah, Sarawak and Labuan F.T.;
- ➤ To provide an opportunity for Rotarians from other areas of RI District 3310 to meet Rotarians from Brunei Darussalam, Sabah, Sarawak and Labuan F. T.

The proposal was readily accepted by the Rotary Club of Sibu and Miri, which was under the leadership of President Clement Tiong and Kiu Chiong Ming respectively.

The first Pan Borneo Intercity Meet was held in Kuching on 8th December 1984. It was attended by the Presidents of all the three clubs and more than thirty Rotarians. In 1987, the Intercity Meet expanded to include Rotary Clubs from Sabah and Brunei to become the Pan Borneo Inter-Clubs Meet.

A tradition of the annual Pan Borneo Inter-Club Meet started then with a Pan Borneo project being carried out by the host club, funded by RM1,000.00 contribution from each participating club in the Pan Borneo.

The Rotary Club of Miri hosted the first Pan Borneo Inter-Clubs Meet, and the first Pan Borneo project was the donation of medical and sports equipment to the Home for the Aged in Miri. The second Pan Borneo Inter-Clubs Meet was hosted by the Rotary Club of Bintulu but no Pan Borneo project carried out. It is now held annually and hosted in rotation by a Rotary Club in Borneo.

In the true spirit of Rotary, participation in the Pan Borneo Inter-Clubs Meet has not been only confined to Rotary Clubs from Borneo. At each Meet, Rotarians from our neighbours also join us in the spirit of fellowship, in peace and understanding, in furthering our guiding principle of Service Above Self.

The Legeony Institution (Leger Seglement as it was then called) was first located at 5th Mile, Rock Road, Kuching, It accommodated about 70 patients. In 1917, a fund in memory of the late Second Rajoh Sir Charles Exercises, it accommodated secur. At patients, in 1917, a fend in memory of the late Second Raph Sir Charles Brooke, was set up and generously supported by the public. With the funds collected, it was possible to build a new Settlement at Saturg Island. This was desirable as the patients were becoming a public multance by begging in the streets and involved in other activities such as gambling, etc.

In 1924, the buildings, houses, stores, dispensary and others were completed and the patients were moved to the new sentement. Unfortunately this site was found to be unsuitable because during the Landas season, surpolies, communications, exteens and other secessistes were extremently difficult. This promoted a move to

In October 1925, the patients were shifted back to the mainland to the present site at 13th Mile, Penrissen a more suitable sanctuary. Road. This new place was found to be ideally suited for the location of the settlement. In 1926 more permanent buildings were constructed by the patients themselves as 'Gotong Rayong Project' from timber and other building materials brought from Satang Island. In the same year (1936) the Government took over full reasoning missorians occupyed storm comming assumed as now harme your \(\text{1.55.00}\) the convenienced town over next propossibility of the settlement, but it was still named as Rajah Charles Brooke Memorial Loper Settlement.

In 1940, permanent administrative block and hospital wards were built which could accommodate about 40 parients who needed proper medical and nursing case due to acute illness, ulcors and complications. Since then progressive expansion and improvements continued to take place until 1962. The present Institution consists of the following infrastructure:

Since its establishment, R.C.B.M. Hospital is the sole Leprosarium providing leprosy care to patients not. only from Saranesk, but also from Sabab, Brunel and Kalimantan Indonesia. As its peak occupation, the patient pital with a total of 62 acreage.

The Sarawak Leprony Control Programme was launched in June 1934. Since then, with the decementipopulation was as many as 500 plus. nation and integration of leptony care into the general medical services, the patient population has progressively declined over the years. Since the launching of Leprosy Control Programme until today a total of 1512 cases are being registered and only 590 are still receiving treatment while the rest were either cured or died of old age. It is estimated that

Leprosy Treatment In Sarawak

Before 1940, leprosy was shought to be an incurable disease. The first medicine introduced for Leproty was Chaulmogra oil injection extracted from the fruit of the Hydrocurpus trees. However it has been found to have no medical value. The greatest advance made in the treatment of leprosty came in 1949 with the discovery of Dapsone, a derivative of Sulphones and was first introduced to this Hospital in 1951, after which a number of Jeproxy patients were cured and discharged from the hospital, thus warrant unnecessary admission to leprosarium. However in 1972 other medicines have since been discovered which are also effective for the treatment of leprosy, there being Lamprene and Rifampicin used as dual therapy with

In 1986 W.H.O. introduced the use of these three drugs i.e. Dapsone, Rifampicin & Lamprene (Ethionamide) and termed as Multiple Deug Thorapy Regime, which are very effective and thus accepted as National Therapy, Now a social of 173 cases are on MDT, while 94 cases are on surveillance and 417 cases are either on Dual Thorapy on Monotherapy.

Leproty as a Disease

It is caused by Mycobacterium Leprae, a gram positive bacilli, invading only the skin and peripheral nerves. It is infectious and contracted through prelonged intimate contacts with the patient, but it is NOT HERIDITARY and its incubation period is about 2-7 years.

Natural body resistance of an individual will determine the severity of the disease, thus the early sign of the disease (Indeterminate) may just disappears if the body resistance is high.

According to W.H.O. definition there are only two types of leprosy namely Paucibacillary and Multibacillary, which can be recognised with the following signs and symptoms:

- White/Red patch or patches over the skin
- Loss of sensation over the while patch(s)
- Not swearing over the while patch(s)
- Swollen and painful peripheral nerves
- Presence of Mycobacterium Leprae in skin smears or skin biopsy.

1994, Rotary Club of Miri

1996, Rotary Club of Kuching

Joint community project - Mass tree planting from Matang Suspension bridge stretching over 1 km to Kampung Gita. The other main project is a Joint community project where all clubs contributed medical, healthcare and recreation equipment.

1997, Rotary Club of Bandar Seri Begawan, Kuala Belait & Labuan

This joint project was undertaken by 3 Rotary Clubs together with Rotary Club of Singapore South for the delivery of a van from Singapore for the Special Home in Labuan

1999, Rotary Club of Bintulu

The project involved the building of a kindergarten for a longhouse community at Rumah Jepi, 17th mile Bintulu Miri Road. The construction work which was undertaken by the longhouse folks on a gotong-royong basis, was started in February 1999 and completed in April of same year.

2000, Rotary Club of Tawau Tanjung

Donation of six units of computers, printers and renovation of IT room for SJK (C) Phui Yuk School, at the rural village of Gudang Empat, Bombalai / Table.

2001, Rotary Club of Sibu

Building of a basketball court for Tong Ah Primary School, Selangau, situated 79km from Sibu Town. The residents are comprised of Chinese and Iban community.

2002, Rotary Club of Labuan

The original project was to raise funds to assist a local school, St. Anne Secondary School to build a science laboratory. However, due to the relocation of all science stream education to another school, the fund raised was used for upgrading of the school's wooden walls to brick walls.

2003, Rotary Club of Lahad Datu

Building of a library for Sekolah Kebangsaan Tanjung Paras at Pulau Sakkar which is 15 minutes by boat from Lahad Datu. The children who attend this school came from low income family who do not have access to computers, and are of low literacy level.

2005, Rotary Club of Brunei

The project was to built Pusat Ehsan which is a sheltered workshop to cater for psychologically impaired people who while not requiring institutionalization have the opportunity to pursue industrial theraphy activity. The mission is to train, assist and care for these people with special needs to enable them achieve their full potential in society.

2006, Rotary Club of Bintulu

Building of a community park to support the government policy to provide open spaces and parks near populated areas for residents to partake in various forms of recreation. The club worked together with Bintulu Development Authority to develop a piece of Land designated as an open space in one of the residential areas in Bintulu.

2007, Rotary Club of Kuching Jaya

Building a pre-school cum resource centre to support pre-school education for low income families for children from nearby villages in Kota Samarahan division.

2008, Rotary Club of Labuan F.T.

Helping the initial set up of a new Home for underprivileged girls of school going age in Labuan. The 1st Fransiscan Sisters and First Step Sdn Bhd are working in partnership to manage the Home. The Home is situated a short distance from the St. Fransiscan Convent.

2009, Rotary Club of Miri

Donation of 150 units of fire extinguishers to 21 longhouses in two constituencies in the District of Miri. The presentation ceremony was held at the Rumah Genetan Ak Dangak at KM54, Miri/Bintulu Road on Sunday 15 March 2009. The officers from the Miri Fire Fighting Services will provide training to the longhouse dwellers on the proper use of the fire extinguishers.

2010, Rotary Club of Tawau Tanjung

Provision of a Children Playgound Facilities and Recycle Centre for Orang-Orang Pekak Tawau (Aokam Benevolment Centre - For the Deaf and Disabled Children)

2011, Rotary Club of Sandakan North

Development of the Elopura Recreation Park with jogging tracks, staircases, pavilions, bargeque area and car parks to provide a comfortable and peaceful outdoor sports and recreation facilities for the Sandakan residents and visitors.

2012, Rotary Club of Penampang

Part financing for the Building fund of a Haemodialysis centre at Donggongon, Penampang known as Kinsabina-Rotary Haemodialysis Centre.

26th Pan Borneo Community Project

In 2012, the Rotary Club of Kuching Central staged a musical concert to raise funds for a project to refurbish an old and unused flats within the compound of the Sarawak General Hospital, and an old site building at the Sarawak Heart Centre, Kota Samarahan. This is a project of our Rotary Club and Yayasan Kebajikan Negara with the cooperation of the Sarawak General Hospital, and in collaboration with various governmental and corporate sponsors.

The fund were to be used to convert these old and unused buildings into hostels to provide free accommodation for the poor and underprivileged needy people from rural areas and those from outside Kuching to stay while attending to their loved ones who are undergoing medical treatment at the Sarawak General Hospital and the Sarawak Heart Centre. These poor parents or relatives need accommodations. Many of them cannot afford the accommodation while in Kuching and ended up sleeping in the wards alongside the patients or in the hallways.

The project at the Sarawak General Hospital has been completed and is ready for occupancy. And we are now intend to embark on the project at the Sarawak Heart Centre.


In conjunction with the Pan Borneo Inter Club Meet, our Club has decided to carry out a Rotary Landscape and Beautification Project in a prominent area at the Sarawak Heart Centre. This project will complement the refurbishment works that will be implemented to provide free accommodations for the poor at the Sarawak Heart Centre.

The site for the proposed landscaping works is presently an empty courtyard. The conversion of this area into a small landscaped park will meet the following objectives and provide the following benefits:

- As this is a high profile hospital frequently visited by Ministers, VIPs and other dignitaries, the project will enhance the Rotary Brand and create better public awareness of the works we do in Rotary- in doing good in the world.

Rotary Club of Kuching Central's Signature Project

Preventive Blindness Project

Preventative Blindness has been one of the Rotary International's principal area of focus, which has also been adopted by our Rotary Club, Rotary Club of Kuching Central, as one of our club's significant project. This project entails the provision of free cataract operations for low-income sector of our communities in various parts of Sarawak.

This project has been carried out on a regular basis together with our partners, namely doctors in the Sarawak Medical Services and private hospitals in Kuching, and our main financial sponsor, CIMB Community Link, the corporate social responsibility arm of the CIMB Bank.

Our Club's first avoidable blindness project was carried out in Kapit from 5 to 8 December 2008, where free cataract operations were successfully performed on 10 out of the 38 patients who have been identified with matured cataracts during the eyescreening project conducted on 17 to 18 November 2007. The others could not be operated on due to various reasons including co-existing medical conditions, self withdrawal and failure to establish contact due to remote place of residence.

In January 2010, our Club brought our avoidable blindness project to the remote Bario highlands. A total of 410 inhabitants in Bario had their eyes and health checked by a team of medical professionals. Of the 410 people, 73% are students of primary and secondary schools, while the balance comprised of the adult members of the community. The project was financed by our club members. Sponsorship was provided by MASWings which gave a 50% discount on the return airfares for the Bario-Miri sector; Zeiss sponsored the lenses for the spectacles: Association of Optometrist Malaysia provided the spectacle frames and Rotary Club of Miri sponsored 20 pairs of reading glasses.

In October 2010, the Rotary Club of Kuching Central launched a Rotary Publicity on Wheels. Under this program, our Club sponsored the publicity on 2 delivery vans owned by Khong Guan Biscuit Factory. As these vans make its way to remote parts of Sarawak delivering Khong Guan biscuits, the graphics on the van convey the message that free cataracts operations are provided for the needy by the Rotary Club of Kuching Central.





In a concerted collaboration between CIMB Foundation, the Department of Health Sarawak, the Ophthalmology Department of Sarawak General Hospital and the Rotary Club of Kuching Central, 29 cataract patients from the low income group living in Serian, Sri Aman, Betong and Lundu were transported to the eye Clinic at the Sarawak General Hospital where they underwent cataract operations. All the 29 cataract operations were successfully carried out over 2 days on 10 and 11 December 2010. All the patients were discharged on 12 December after post-surgical examinations. The Project was fully sponsored by CIMB Foundation.

From 9 to 12 June 2011, free cataract and ptergium operations were carried out in the Daro Hospital for 43 low-income individuals who lived in Pulau Beruit. These patients, each accompanied by their next-of-kin, were transported by chartered express boat to be admitted into the Daro Hospital. All the operations were successful, and the patients were transported back home to Pulau Beruit after post operation review.

The Project was financed by CIMB Foundation and other sponsors, such as Harwood Timber Sdn Bhd and Normah Medical Foundation and Charitable Trust Board as well as The Crocodile Foundation of Singapore.

On 11 August 2012, our Club, with the sponsorship of CIMB Foundation, donated 100 cataract lenses to the Sibu Hospital. These lenses are provided for free to needy patients from Sibu, Dalat, Kapit, and other nearby villages, who requires cataract operations.


