

INTERNATIONAL SERVICE PROJECTS

LOMBOK EARTHQUAKE

District 3310's response based on input from Dr Yap Lip Kee, Chairman of our District Disaster Relief Committee

Initial response

Initial response came **from 2 clubs** to their sister clubs in Indonesia:

- RC Singapore remitted USD 5000 to RC Malang. Central RC Kuching Central remitted MYR4,800 to Yayasan Rotary Club of Bali Kuta
- 2. **RC Singapore remitted USD 5000** to RC Malang Central (includes donation from Ish K Foundation)

District Governor Henry Tan sought permission from D3310 Board to **release RM50,000** from the District General Fund.

A request for donations came from the District Governor to all Presidents and Assistant Governors.

Our clubs responded with pledges for RM13,900 and SGD/BND17,000 to the District Disaster Fund.

Following discussions from PDG Al Purwa and DGN Nyomanto,

it became clear that the **help** Lombok residents needed was **aid in the Recovery /Rebuilding Phase.**

Plan to respond to request for **aid in Recovery /Rebuilding Phase:**

- The District Disaster Relief teams led by PDG Al Purwa and DGN Nyomanto to carry out a survey.
- 2. Installation of pilot Skyhydrant facilities to provide clean water to communities, schools, hospitals & key facilities.

 (Cost of equipment estimated at RM40,000)

- 3. The disbursement of the remaining RM10,000 (and any additional collection) to go towards purchase of torches, LED lights and household filters as per request from District 3420. (D3310 will work on the basis of acquiring all equipment locally if feasible)
- 4. Application of **Global Grant** to **provide clean water** to those in need. (The assistance of PDG AI Purwa, DGN Nyoman, PP Shahul and PP Ng Yaw Hua will be sought)

At short notice, a team **led by PP Nelson Loong** has joined PDG Al Purwa from 12 to 14 September **to survey the situation**.


PP Nelson Loong went on behalf of disaster Relief Committee, District 3310. PP KK Looi went on behalf of Disaster Aid Malaysia, Howard Bradfield, Chairman of Disaster Aid Australia.

On 12 Sept afternoon our team went to Gombang, North Lombok to build 50 wooden homes and install one Skyhydrant and on 13 September, we installed 100 Shelterbox and another Skyhydrant (which provided drinking water)

KERALA FLOODS

Funds were collected to assist the flood victims of Kerala.

This was followed by a recce team which is hosted by the Rotary Club of Cochin to carry out a survey.

1. DONATION OF CONTACT LENS



RC of Sibu donated 50 contact lens to the low income group.

2. ROTARY CLUB OF SARIKEI CHARITY RUN

The **charity run** received media coverage on 10 Sep 2018. There were around **826 participants**.



3. DONATION OF A TRUCK



RC of Singapore West handed over a truck to Teen Challenge on 19 Sep 2018. This organisation provides solution to the pressing

needs of the marginalised in our community, particularly to those struggling with substance abuse and alcohol addictions.

4. NATURE FUN WALK & CYCLE 2018

This event was held on 29 Sep 2018 at the Senai Estate, Senai.
