



NEW ROTARY LOGO

Rotary International President-elect Mark Daniel Maloney explained his vision for building a stronger Rotary, calling on leaders to expand connections to their communities and to embrace innovative membership models.

PE Maloney, a member of the Rotary Club of Decatur, Alabama, USA, unveiled the 2019-20 presidential theme, Rotary Connects the World, to incoming district governors at Rotary's annual training event, the International Assembly, in San Diego, California, USA, on Monday.

"The first emphasis is to grow Rotary — to grow our service, to grow the impact of our projects, but most importantly, to grow our membership so that we can achieve more," PE Maloney said.

Fourth, **share your achievements with other clubs**. You can do this by submitting articles to our "District Information & Communication" via the link in our District website.


Do update "Club Central" once you have completed your project/s preferably with photos so that RI and our District will be kept informed.


