

Rotary

Rotary is a worldwide organization of business and professional leaders that provides humanitarian services, encourages high ethical standards in all vocations, and helps build goodwill and peace in the world. Approximately 1.2 million Rotarians belong to more than 34,000 Rotary clubs located in 200 countries.



Object of Rotary

FIRST The development of an acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

SECOND High ethical standards in business and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

THIRD The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;

FOURTH The advancement of international understanding, goodwill and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

The Guide to Daily Living

Before doing the things we intend to do, consider the precepts of The Guide to Daily Living

Ask ourselves these four questions and act upon them:

FIRST Have I spent some time in self-examination?

SECOND Have I spent meaningful time with my family?

THIRD Have I given the best to my work?

FOURTH Have I given some time to others, near and far?

THE FOUR - WAY TEST OF THE THINGS WE THINK, SAY AND DO

In 1932, Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor created the Four-Way-Test, a code of ethics adopted by Rotary 11 years later. The test, which has been translated into more than 100 languages, asks the following questions:

Of the things we think, say or do...

1. Is it the **TRUTH**?

2. Is it **FAIR** to all concerned?

3. Will it build **GOODWILL** and **BETTER FRIENDSHIPS**?

4. Will it be **BENEFICIAL** to all concerned?

The Four-Way Test can be used profitably in checking your relations with others. It is suggested that first you memorize the Four-Way Test and then formulate the habit of checking your thoughts , words and deeds with it.

The Four-Way Test is now being used successfully around the world in business, government and schools as an effective measuring stick of ethics. It is a guide to RIGHT thinking. If memorized and constantly applied to relations with others, it will make a definite contribution towards more effective and friendlier relationships with others.

Since to a large degree our thoughts determine our actions, character and destiny, you naturally will be interested in using this simple method of directing your thoughts in the right direction.

The experience of others has shown that if you get into the habit of checking your thoughts, words and deeds against the Four-Way Test it will definitely help you become happier and more successful throughout your life.



Proposals for a museum, a creative park and a modern community club are among the ideas put forward for the prime Orchard Road site, which was once the site of the former Singapore Chinese Girls' School (SCGS).



The site, which covers about 1.5 hectares, is a prime location for development. It is currently zoned for residential use, but there are plans to rezone it for a mix of residential, commercial and community uses.

The SCGS alumni association has proposed three main options for the site. The first is a museum that would showcase the school's history and its role in the community. The second is a creative park that would provide a space for performing arts, sports and other community activities. The third is a modern community club that would serve as a multi-generational hub for the community.

Former SCGS students, who were part of the school's founding generation, are leading the effort to conserve the site. They have formed a committee to study the site and propose viable options for its future.
