Dear fellow Rotarians and Rotaractors,

I am pleased to report that our district membership is at 2131 - A net increase of 57 members. 



Club Growth (District Chart) Data as on : 01 September 2020



Rotarians who have been Club Presidents will be able to relate a noteworthy event during the Rotary year when the District Governor visits your club. What is the significance of a District Governor visit? What does the 'visit' entail and how can the Club Presidents as well as members prepare to get the most out of the District Governor visit?

The District Governor visit (DG visit) as the name suggests is a visit to your Rotary Club by the current District Governor and is accompanied by the Assistant Governor. It gives District Governor the opportunity to know the club, their leaders and members better and vice versa.

If Clubs wish to get the most out of the DG visit, it's imperative that the Club echelons work through the 'DG visit checklist', prepare the necessary documents and inform the respective Committee Chairs to prepare a short and simple presentation for second part of the DG visit. If the DG visit falls on the halfway mark of the Rotary Year, the Club President may present the milestones achieved in the first half of the Rotary Year.

The DG visit comprises two parts - The first part of the meeting will allow District Governor to know more intimately the key personnel in the Club's echelons and the modus operandi, best practices, governance and transparency of the various Rotary Clubs. The second part of the DG visit involves the DG presiding over the club's meeting/assembly where projects, budgets, and goals are presented. The District Governor in turn shares with the club members RI and District goals and upcoming events in the current Rotary year. The District Governor may share experiences he has had with other Clubs as good practices to improve the operations and governance of the club.

Some Rotary Clubs induct new members or recognize TRF giving members during the DG visit while most incorporate a fellowship lunch or dinner with the DG once the official matters are out of the way. There are no magic formulae and it's up to discretion of clubs and their DG. The Assistant Governor often act as a bridge between the Club Presidents and the DG, facilitating communications especially if the Club President is unfamiliar with the DG and vice versa.

DG visits are memorable and fun affairs. It's an important event on the Rotary calendar for the Club to showcase their achievements and 'impress' the District Governor. As much as the official matters stand in the way, it's usually tucked away quickly and Rotarians are normally quick to dress down to enjoy a great evening of fellowship with good food, albeit with safe distancing measures in place. District Governors are required to 'rate' the club they visit according to the 'health' condition of the club and taking this into account, it's imperative that the Rotary Club be organized properly for the much-anticipated visit.

The Flag off "STEP UP TO END POLIO CHALLENGE" was on 29 August 2020.

The World Health Organisation (WHO) has declared Africa to be Polio-free. With years of hard work to eradicate polio from the world, Afghanistan and Pakistan are the last two countries in the world where Polio still exists. No child should be deprived of the right to walk because the vaccine did not reach the children in time. The Global Polio Eradication Initiative was started by Rotary in 1988. This initiative aimed to leverage the network of Rotary clubs in 200 countries to eradicate polio.

World Polio Day (WPD) is on 24 Oct 2020. In commemoration of World Polio Day, District 3310 held a flag off on 29 August 2020 for the 8-week Challenge.

#### What is the Challenge?

1. Steps Challenge to complete 250,000 or 500,000 steps in 8 weeks and/or

2. Weight loss challenge of 3,6 or 8 kg in 8 weeks.


