Dear fellow Rotarians and Rotaractors,

I trust in this pandemic period there have been several challenges, but I believe you have weathered the storm with innovative solutions to continue to serve our communities and beyond. One example is the many COVID-related response projects that are being undertaken by clubs. There is no stopping in our District to continue to help our communities and finding alternative means to carry out projects, including Global Grant projects.

As for the District Committees, they have been vibrant in conducting trainings, seminars, competitions, fund raising and other activities. 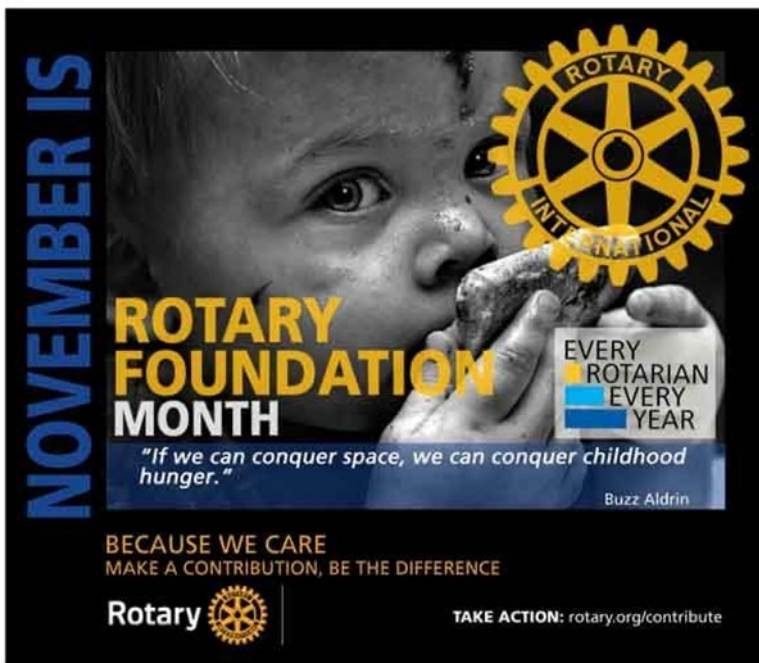

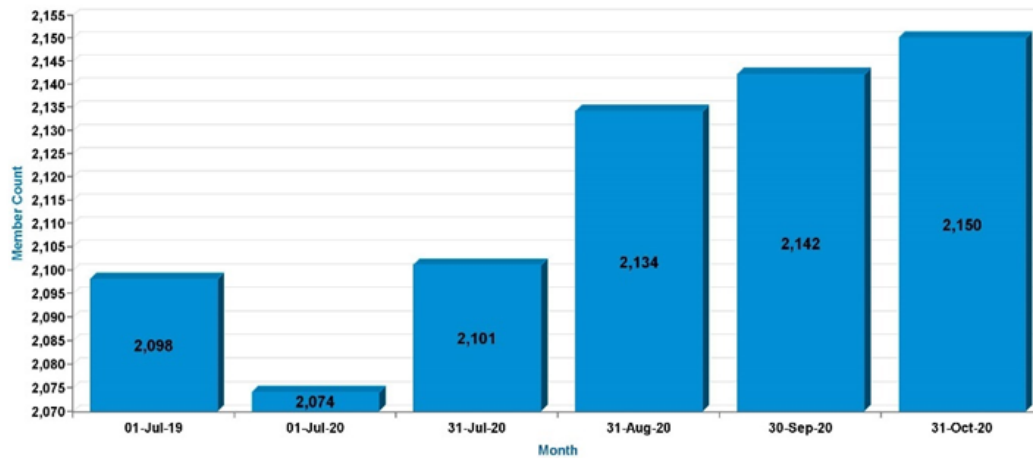

For Rotary Year (2020 - 2021)



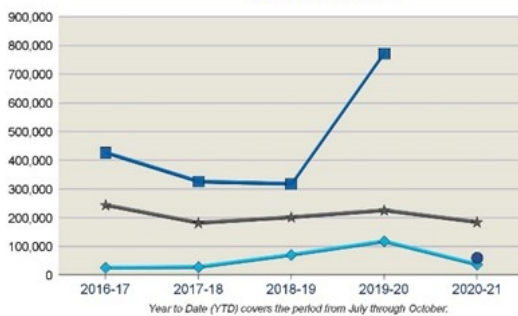

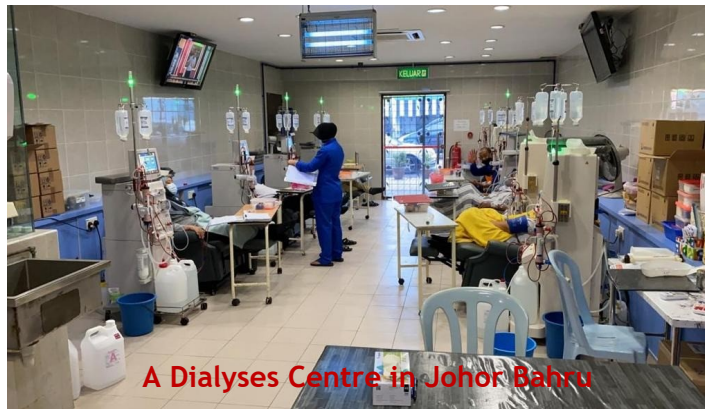
## Community Service Update by District Community Service Chair PP Khushroo Dastur

Over the past couple of months the Regional Community Service Directors have been compiling service projects completed and/or planned by the clubs for the current Rotary year. A total of 40 clubs responded reporting they have in total over 200 projects lined up for Rotary Year 2020/21.

Under the current COVID 19 pandemic most clubs in the District have been restricted in their activities. However, they have been actively involved in providing support to the community, either with meals, PPEs or masks. 45 clubs in the District participated in the COVID 19 Response Strategy, undertaking a total of 38 projects, with a total value of RM863,000 (USD 208,000). 7,800 families were provided with food aid. Another 14000 PPE and 88,000 masks and shields were also distributed.

A large number of clubs are very active improving the lives of the residents in their communities by donating books and laptops to schools, planning blood donation campaigns and donating wheel chairs. A case in point, when the entire 20 door longhouse, about 385 km from Kuching was razed in a fire, members of RC Kuching Central handed over 1400 assorted clothing to the residents in coordination with Uniqlo Malaysia.

Some of the more outstanding Signature Projects in the District are the Dialyses Centres that are managed individually by six Rotary Clubs in Johor Bahru which have been supporting the community for years. Also the Dyslexic Association of Singapore which was started by RC Raffles club over 30 years ago and today has over 14 Centres island wide. RC BSB has been active in their water project for laboration with Sabah State Edu- REAL (Rural Focus English For All) since its inception in 2017. More and more Rotary clubs in the focus on the environment. 5 clubs District have shown increased in Kuching are doing a joint project "Thrash traps to cleaning the river" to protect the environment and provide clean water. RC Kampong Gelam is working with Club HEAL in greening the centers, leading towards urban farming in the future and RC BSB and clubs in Kuching are involved in Beach Cleaning project as well as a Tree planting project. A similar Tree Planting project is also planned for all clubs in Singapore sometime second quarter of 2021.

There is also an increased focus to do joint projects.. RC Sarekei is co-ordinating with Sarekei hospital to provide them with free Intraocular Lens (IOL) for the poor elderly cataract patients and Rotary Eclub of 3310 is partnering with them to source donors for 200 IOLs. In conjunction with World Mental Health Day, RC Jurong Town and RC Singapore joined hands with National University Of Singapore – Mind Science Center to promote awareness of their Age Well Everyday (AWE) programme in the community. The two clubs also got together with Chamber Music Singapore to provide an on line concert "Symphony of Motherhood", specially created for not-yet born babies and expecting mothers. RC Tanglin, RC JT and RC KG have joined hands with RC Singapore to assist in distributing FFTH (Food From The Heart) foodpacks, vegetables, fruits and eggs to 59 households.

A few clubs stand out in their focus on community service, both by quality of their projects and the high number of projects. These are... RC Singapore, Rotary Eclub of 3310, RC KK Pearl, RC Johor Bahru, RC Kuching Central and RCBSB. These active clubs need to make an extra effort to take on some of the smaller clubs and get them involved in joint projects.



The main thrust of the District Vocational Service Committee is to revitalize Vocational Service as: “The Bedrock of Rotary.”

#### District Vocational Service Project I – Water and Sanitation

In line with the six areas of Rotary, the committee had conceived the idea of linking these six areas of service in Rotary to the expertise that exist in the District. Towards this end, the committee has developed a project called District Vocational Dialogue or DVD for short. This project entails the identification of expertise in the District along the line of Rotary six areas of service and link it to existing or potential projects related to the respective areas of service organized by clubs.

The committee organized the 1<sup>st</sup> DVD on 19th September 2020 in which an expert on Water Purification Rtn Bashir Ahmad from the Rotary Club of Kampong Gelam was featured. During that two-hour session, which was convened by DG Mohan, Rtn Bashir was interviewed by CP Tengku Indra on five basic questions on the scarcity of water in the world and how water purification systems are developed using various technologies.

After the dialogue with Rtn Bashir, PDG Andre Suharto conducted a 45-minute dialogue with two Water Purification Project Leaders namely:

PP Wong Chin Toon from the Rotary Club of Bandar Seri Begawan

PP Ny Yaw Hua from the Rotary Club of Kuching Central

The dialogue focused on several aspects of the water purification and sanitation projects such as:

Community assessments for water supply and purification

Members participation and engagement

Benefits to the community and club

Cost and funding of the projects

During the discussion, PDG Andre linked the importance of “Water and Sanitation” area of focus for Rotary to the projects implemented in the two clubs.

The Zoom event received very strong support by Rotarians amounting to 73 attendees who fielded lots of questions during the 45 mins. session.

#### District Vocational Service Project II – Prevention and Treatment of Diseases

The committee is looking into the 2<sup>nd</sup> DVD project for November. The committee envisaged organizing 3 to 4 DVDs during the current Rotary Year and ensure the project becomes sustainable into the next Rotary Year 2021-2022 and henceforth.

Annual Vocational Service Lecture during the Vocational Service Month in January 2021.

This is another sustainable project the committee plans to develop for the current Rotary year making it repeatable on annually. This involves the invitation of a prominent external speaker to talk about “Excellence in Vocation or Profession.”

The committee is studying the prospect of launching this project in January 2021.



A RYLA committee meeting was held on 28 July 2020 @ 8pm.

Discussed on regional RYLA for year 2020/2021, identifying Host Clubs and on challenges expected.

AG Richard Ong of eClub of 3310 supposed to organise in November, his Club rejected his proposal.

On 8 September 2020, AG Chandran & I had RYLA talk on RC Johor Bahru's Club meeting at Double Tree Hilton.

Physical RYLA in March or June 2021 has been offered to RCJB to host. Talks are progressing well.

RC Muar is planning to conduct a RYLA targeting specifically medical students and doctors only in January.

An online RYLA Alumni is scheduled on 21 November 10am.

Online RYLA is scheduled for December 19, 2020.

### **District 3310 Rotary Friendship Exchange Committee Report by PP Choo Chor Tek**

The District 3310 Rotary Friendship Exchange (RFE) Committee had looked forward eagerly to organising a return RFE visit to District 3030 Maharashtra, India during this Rotary year 2020-2021, after hosting a RFE team of five (5) Rotarian couples from District 3030, led by Team Leader Rotarian Vilas Shirore, from 31st January, 2020 to 6th February, 2020.

But no thanks to the coronavirus and the uncertainties caused by the Covid 19 pandemic, a physical RFE to District 3030 has to be suspended. During the Covid 19 pandemic, all physical RFEs have to be put on hold and Rotary clubs and Rotarians worldwide that are keen to participate in this exchange programme have no choice but to do so virtually.

District 3030 has agreed to organise a virtual RFE with District 3310 sometime in December 2020. The dates will be announced in due course.

We look forward to participating in the upcoming virtual RFE and to sending a team to District 3030 for a physical exchange as soon as the Covid 19 pandemic situation permits.





Due to the escalated COVID 19 virus cases in Sabah, on 27<sup>th</sup> of October, the District Sabah COVID 19 Response Task Force was formed. The Task Force chair is PP KP Lu of Likas Bay and shall include PP Datuk Lee Swi Heng, PP Dato Jimmy Pang as members and PP Ng Yaw Hua as the advisor. The terms of reference for the Task Force is to review the ground situation and invite Rotary clubs in Sabah to participate in the matching grants. Evaluate the applications and approve as appropriate. Manage the funds and follow up with reports from the participating clubs and submit a final report to the District Governor.

Separately a Global Grant project to supply medical equipment to hospitals in Sabah worth US\$62,500 in draft application. This is a District initiative represented by all Rotary clubs in Sabah but RC Luyang will take the lead as the host partner and work with clubs from Taiwan as the International partner.
