




OBJECT OF ROTARY

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

FIRST: The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

SECOND: High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

THIRD: The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;

FOURTH: The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

THE FOUR-WAY TEST

The Four-Way Test is a nonpartisan and nonsectarian ethical guide for Rotarians to use for their personal and professional relationships. The test has been translated into more than 100 languages, and Rotarians recite it at club meetings:

Of the things we think, say or do

- 1. Is it the **TRUTH**?
- 2. Is it **FAIR** to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- 4. Will it be **BENEFICIAL** to all concerned?

GREETINGS, MY DEAR CHANGEMAKERS,

am sure you are having an enriching experience as you *Serve to Change Lives*. One of the ways you can make the greatest change in a person's life is to help them learn to read. Literacy opens up the world to us. It makes

us better informed about life in our own communities and opens vistas to other cultures. Reading and writing connects people and gives us another way to express our love for one another.

September is Basic Education and Literacy Month in Rotary. Enhancing literacy skills is critical in our pursuit of reducing poverty, improving health, and promoting peace. In fact, if all students in low-income countries left school with basic reading skills, it would result in a significant cut in global poverty rates.

Without education, illiterate children become illiterate adults. Today, 14 percent of the world's adult population — 762 million people — lack basic reading and writing skills. Two-thirds of that group are women. Literacy and numeracy skills are essential to obtaining better housing, health care, and jobs over a lifetime.

Especially for girls and women, literacy can be a lifeor-death issue. If all girls completed their primary education, there would be far fewer maternal deaths. And a child is more likely to survive past age 5 if he or she is born to a mother who can read. Improving outcomes for more people worldwide is possible only if countries remove barriers to education for girls. The economic argument for doing so is clear: In some countries where schooling is geared toward boys, the cost of missed economic opportunity is more than \$1 billion per year. Empowering people through education is among the boldest goals we have as Rotarians. We don't have to travel far from our homes to encounter those whose lives are being curtailed because they struggle with reading, rely on others to read for them, or cannot write anything more than their own name.

Starting this month, consider how your club can *Serve* to Change Lives through literacy: Support local organizations that offer free programs to support adult literacy or local language learning, or that provide teachers with professional development centered around reading and writing. Become literacy mentors, or work with an organization like the Global Partnership for Education to increase learning opportunities for children around the world. Have conversations with local schools and libraries to see how your club can support their existing programs or help create needed ones in your community.

In India, the TEACH program, a successful collaboration between the country's Rotary clubs and its government, has demonstrated how to scale up literacy efforts to reach millions of children. And at a time when schools across India were closed due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the program's e-learning component reached more than 100 million children through national television.

Literacy is the first step out of poverty. As Nobel laureate Malala Yousafzai has noted, "One child, one teacher, one book, and one pen can change the world."

社长文告

各位亲爱的改变者:我確信各位在以服务改善 人生方面都有丰富的经验。各位在他人人生中 能促成最大改变的方法之一,就是协助他们学 会阅读。识字为我们开启世界。它让我们更了 解自己社區的生活,並看見其他文化。阅读及 写字让人们连结,給我们另一个表达对彼此的 爱的方法。

9月是扶轮的基础教育與识字月。在我们追求 減少贫穷、改善健康、促进和平的过程中,提 升识字能力是很关键的。事实上,如果低收入 所有学生离开学校時都具备基本阅读技能,便 可促成全球贫穷率大幅下降。

沒有教育,不识字的儿童会成为不识字的成人。 今天,全球成年人口中有 14%—7 亿 6,200 万人 —缺乏基础阅读及写字能力。这群人中有三分 之二是女性。识字及算术能力攸关人一生中能 否取得更好的房子、医疗保健,及工作。

尤其是对女孩及女性來說, 识字可能会是攸关 生死的事。如果所有的女孩都能完成基础教育, 产妇死亡的人数必然大幅下降。婴兒的母親如 果识字, 那他就比较可能存活超過5岁。要改 善全球各地人们的收入, 国家就要先移除女孩 受教育的障碍。这么做的经济理由很明显: 在 一些学校教育為男孩专属的国家, 错失的经济 机会的成本每年超過10亿美元。

透過教育來为人们增能是我们作為扶轮社員最 大胆的目标之一。我們很容易在生活周 遭看到那些因为阅读有困難、依赖他人替他 们阅读、或是除了自己姓名外不会写字的人, 他们的生活因此受到多大的限制。 從这个月開始,思考貴社要如何透过识字以 服务改善人生:支持提供免費课程支持成人 识字或学习當地语言的地方组织,或是提供 教師以阅读及写字為重点的专业发展训练。 成為识字辅导員,或是与「全球教育夥伴」 (Global Partnership for Education)合作來增加世 界各地兒童的学习机会。与当地学校及图书 馆商谈,看看貴社要如何支持它们現有的计 划或是协助在社区创办必要的计划。

在印度,扶轮社與政府成功推动的 TEACH 计 划,已经证明如何扩大识字工作來接触数百 万名儿童。在印度各地学校因新冠疫情而关 闭之际,该计划的网路学习透過全国电視网 接觸到超過1亿名儿童。

识字是摆脫贫穷的第一步。就像诺贝尔獎得 主马拉拉所說的: 「一個孩子,一位老师, 一本书,还有一支笔就能改变世界。」





She spoke about the steps involved in crafting Rotary's Vision Statement and the Rotary Strategic Priorities (also known as The Rotary Action Plans) which had been rolled out since 2019.

The RI Strategic Planning Committee scope of works were determined by the board of Rotary International because the latter acknowledged the fact that the end of Polio is coming; we need to prepare for Rotary post Polio and we need a vision and a clear path.

PDG Natalia also informed all participants that the terms of reference for the RI Strategic Planning Committee are to:

- develops, recommends, and updates a strategic plan for consideration by the Board and Trustees
- Surveys Rotarians at least every three years to review and make recommendations pertaining to the strategic plan
- Other duties as assigned

The committee was also binded by its ground rules:

- Be bold and candid, speak your mind openly and honestly
- Brainstorm without fear
- Be non-defensive
- Everyone must participate
- Listen carefully with an open mind, do not interrupt
- Be prepared to get out of your comfort zone
- Be willing to understand and commit, not agree
- Stay on topic
- Focus on what and why, not how
- Come to terms with the importance of this once-in-a-lifetime moment in Rotary's history

The objectives of the virtual session was to help Rotarians understand the Rotary Vision Statement and Action Plan more effectively because the latter represents the ultimate foundation in everything that we do.

We are grateful to Past District Governor Haji Andre Suharto for inviting our GEM, the first lady District Governor in District 3400, to speak in our district. There was a total of 149 participants from 20 districts across 14 countries. We thank Rotarians for your presence and participation!

Rotary GEM #3 will be held on October 25th, 2021 (Monday), at 8pm-9pm Singapore/Malaysia/Brunei. Save the date, and stay tuned for the person who will be the next featured GEM!

The Rotary Club of Luyang was chartered in 1997 and just like all other Rotary Clubs around the world, the charter members came up with a club logo that took its design cues from Rotary International logo while at the same time incorporated local elements for a unique identity that set it apart from other Clubs. Over the span of 17 years, members of the Club used the logo extensively as an essential part of our public image and was always present in one form or another wherever we go and carry out our activities.





There were various printed material, all kinds of banners, stickers, casual shirts, jackets, activity tshirts, vests, and one that remained my favourite – a set of cufflinks that 2012-2013 Club President Halim Egoh commissioned for all members.

Naturally the Luyang Rotarians grew to love and strongly identify themselves with the logo alongside the old Rotary International logo. The community that we served recognise it wherever they see it, and it was really heart-warming to hear very positive comments from people whenever the logo appear in public as they have come to associate it with a group of kind-hearted leaders within their own communities.

Another interesting and very noticeable observation back then was how all logos of Rotary Clubs naturally tend to represent something about the Clubs' background, whether geographical, culture, industry and even aspirations of that particular group of Rotarians or community. Many times one only need to glance at a particular logo to already know something about the Club and where it's located (maps as part of a logo), or the kind of industry prevalent in that community, etc. Exchanging bannerettes when visiting each other was very much a tradition for many Rotarians, and these collection of bannerettes often get turned into a bigger banner, a tapestry of goodwill from around the globe proudly adorning many a meeting room where community needs are being discussed, and solutions debated, among the many things that we do.



When the rebranding exercise of Rotary International came about in 2014, Rotary Club of Luyang immediately adopted the new Visual Identity guidelines without hesitation. The Club members understood the importance of having a coherent identity for an organisation as large and global as Rotary International. It was an easy undertaking after all, as everything has been laid out clearly and there were ample resources for any Rotarian to refer to and follow.

I was the Club president in 2013-2014 when the rebranding exercise was announced and as the person who was also responsible for our Club's branding at the time, I realised how much the original Club logo has become an integral part of our identity and it will be a very unfortunate to simply discard it completely. This is mainly due to the fact that Club members themselves have always been aware of the importance of a good public image and having a strong presence by having our logo prominently displayed at the right and significant places during most of our activities.

Therefore as I worked on our Club's new identity, I made a personal decision to incorporate the old logo into our updated Club's letterhead design. This was very well received and all successive Presidents adopted the design to this day. While most of the Club's branding use only the current RI identity and guideline, we also try to include the old logo in other applications but only if and when situations provide for it.

There is no doubt that Rotary International's global public image initiative, which brought about the streamlined visual identity for all Rotary Clubs around the world like we see today was certainly a right and necessary move. One can only imagine the plethora of imageries - 34,823 logo variations to be exact in 2014! Or dare I say it... diverse! It must have been quite a confusing time for many non-Rotarians but then again, I do wonder if there is a place, even if only for nostalgic reasons that we ensure these images and what they represent, are not lost and forgotten forever.

Bakat Interact (BI) is one of RCKK's flagship project carried out annually since Rotary Year 1983/84. Every year, students from Interact schools around KK will prepare their performances in the form of group dancing and band and singing to compete against each. It's one of the most anticipated annual event for the students as they are able to showcase their talents. Bakat Interact has been a platform for the youths to display their musical finesse and is normally attended by no less than 400 – 500 spectators gathered in convention halls in KK.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, BI was disheartenedly called off in 2020. But in 2021, without wanting to let the pandemic strip the students off from the hype and opportunity to be a part of BI, we have decided to hold the first ever BAKAT INTERACT in virtual form, hence the project **BAKAT INTERACT 2021: We've Got Soul**, is conceived and carried though. The theme is based on the musical genre of soul, in which is both technical and has depth in expression that requires participants to display their musical skills and expressiveness.

The event comprises of two main components for the students to take part. Firstly, the competition segment. Divided into solo singing and solo dancing, the participants are required to video record their performances and send it through via email for the judging team to assess and comment. The top 6 of both categories will then be selected to be presented during the actual event day where the video recording comments of judges will also be played subsequently for all spectators to see. Out the top 6 finalists, only the 3 top winners will stand a chance to win the prize money. The 2nd main component is the band music video and dance music videos featuring the representatives from the Interact Schools in KK. These representative's video and audio recorded their designated parts as set by the band and dance directors which is sent to be mixed, mastered, edited and produced into two complete music videos where it created a sense of making music and dancing in unity despite being separated geographically.

Moreover, the event is also filled with special performances by the judges, Rotarians and even the committee members. Graced by the presence of DG Dolly and with special PE James Lee from RC Singapore, the event has recorded a highest attendance of 265 attendees tuning in from Kota Kinabalu, west Malaysia, Tawau and Singapore. There was a total of 49 competition entries spanning across Sabah district.

The atmosphere was Fun, interactive, hyped and entertaining throughout as the students spammed their responses in the chat section, expressing their involvement and excitement. It has been a truly beneficial and fruitful event for not just the Interactors and Rotarians, but also for the friends and family who decided to tune in to support. Impact of Rotary spirit is truly felt.


Rotaract Youth Leadership Camp (RYLC)
