OBJECT OF ROTARY

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

FIRST: The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

SECOND: High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

THIRD: The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;

FOURTH: The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

THE FOUR-WAY TEST

The Four-Way Test is a nonpartisan and nonsectarian ethical guide for Rotarians to use for their personal and professional relationships. The test has been translated into more than 100 languages, and Rotarians recite it at club meetings:

Of the things we think, say or do

- 1. Is it the **TRUTH**?
- 2. Is it **FAIR** to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- 4. Will it be **BENEFICIAL** to all concerned?







GREETINGS, MY DEAR CHANGEMAKERS,

A

quarter of the Rotary year is now behind us. I am sure you are helping Rotary to grow more and do more. And I hope you have already done your part for the Each One, Bring One initiative by introducing

one person to Rotary.

Do you ever think about your earliest days as a Rotarian? I often do — because those first moments of discovering the power of service shaped who I am today. When I joined my Rotary club, our efforts focused on India's rural communities, where people were living without toilets, getting their drinking water from the same pond they bathed in, and sending their children to outdoor classrooms set up under a tree. The nearest health care provider often was miles away — and the services were inadequate. But after Rotary clubs carried out some service projects, the villages had toilets, clean drinking water, a classroom for early learning, and a nearby health care center.

The spark that Rotary kindled within me forced me to look beyond myself and embrace humanity. It made service a way of life and led me to a guiding principle I still stand by: Service is the rent I pay for the space I occupy on Earth.

If you feel the need to reignite the spark of service in yourself or your club, October — Community Economic Development Month — is a great time to do so. When we work to improve the lives of people in underserved communities — through, for example, projects that provide vocational training and access to financial resources we help build and sustain local economic growth. The need is great. According to the United Nations, 9 percent of the world's population — that's 700 million people, a majority of them in sub-Saharan Africa — live on less than \$1.90 a day. By supporting strong community development as well as entrepreneurs, we can help improve conditions for people in that region and others.

Your club can also promote economic development in your own community by expanding vocational training opportunities through local schools and community colleges, partnering with lenders to improve access to financial services, or working with a nonprofit that provides resources to entrepreneurs and connects them with the business community.

Of course, developing strong communities is impossible without strong public health. On 24 October, World Polio Day, we'll celebrate our tremendous progress in the effort to eradicate polio. But we also know the fight is not over. We still need your help raising funds and awareness to ensure that all children are immunized against polio. Please don't forget to activate your clubs on that important day and encourage them to donate here: **endpolio.org/world-polio-day.**

Service has been rewarding for me throughout my life. I know the same is true for many of you. Join me this month in becoming a good tenant of our planet by helping others to better themselves and their communities. Together, we can *Serve to Change Lives*.

The total cost of the 1000 Jacket is RM80,000, a huge amount indeed. Thank you to my beloved club, RC Kulai for making this bomber jacket possible by paying the 1st and 2nd down payments. My heartfelt appreciation to my President William Wong and his board. He has ordered 30 Jackets to be given to our club members. Each member shall pay US50.00 to the polio fund. Thank you for your support. RC Kulai is the host club. kindly refer to PP Jerry Lau when ordering the Jacket.

GREAT NEWS to announcing that PDG Michael Yee pledged to contribute US10,000 to the polio fund and AG Jimmy Cheong of RC Changi pledge US5,000, RC Singapore has pledged to contribute US15,000. Dear Fellow Rotarians and friends, good to see you again.

The moment I have been waiting for to share with you my journey but before I do that, I would like to launch the End Polio Now Bomber Jacket and Wristwatch. Yes, someone said I already have a few jackets in my closet and some even said I do not wear watches. I remember selling the 100 EPN watch in less than a month when I first thought of how to raise fund for PolioPlus and that started 6 years ago. Thank you, President Linda of RC Changi and members, for hosting and promoting the EPN wristwatches. I was told that out of the 100 watches for Singapore Rotarians and friends, she has sold 40 watches and 10 are on reserved. Thank you, President Linda.

The host club for Sabah is RC Kinabalu Sutera. 34 watches have been taken by Sabah. Thank you to District Polio Chair Datin Betty Hiew. Very kind of her to pay in advance for the watches


















DG SPECIAL MESSAGE






CLIMB TO CHANGE LIVES is one of the challenging journey of my Governorship.






Meet our featured GEM, **PP Jimmy Leong** of RC Puteri Lagoon, Johore.

10 OCT - RC KOTA KINABALU - HIGH FLOW NASAL CANNULA DONATION



Every minute, our doctors in the hospitals are force to make difficult decision as to who should be given priority in receiving treatment including utilising the very limited supply of medical equipment.

One of the equipment is the High Flow Nasal Cannula (HFNC). HFNC is a non-evasive ventilator that provide great respiratory support to reduce risk of requiring intubation and admission to the ICU.

Public hospitals in Kota Kinabalu are urgently in need of the HFNC. The sufficient supply of HFNC will certainly improve mortality rate of many Covid19 patients.

The donation of one unit of HFNC to Likas Hospital is yet another successful collaboration between OCBC Bank (Malaysia) Berhad (OCBC) and the Rotary Club of Kota Kinabalu (RCKK). Upon RCKK's reaching out, OCBC graciously agreed to donate the said HFNC and other consumables which cost RM27,000.00. More than 2,000 patients are set to benefit from this new HFNC.

16 OCT - RC KOTA KINABALU PEARL SUGUD FLOOD RELIEF MISSION



Water comparison at Kg Sugud

On 16th October 2021, President Majella Marjorie Tan Marguez and the RCKK Pearl members went to Kg Mahansung, Kg Timpangoh, Kg Kodou and Kaanapan, to deliver EFINITY water filters to 106 families. 76 water filters were donated by Pertubuhan Komuniti ELITE and Thiam Lai Yean Foundation while 30 units were from Rotary District 3310 Disaster Relief Grant. The team showed the villagers how to use the water filters. Gravity pipes at the village were damaged due to the recent flood and landslides, and this severely affected the villagers' water supply. It is hoped that the water filters would bring much relief in the form of clean water for cooking and drinking. Water and Sanitation, also known as Project WASH, is one of RCKK Pearl's signature projects. In early October, the Club delivered 25 water filters and 28 Solar lights to affected families in Kg Pangasaan, Sugud. The club also recently donated water filters to 65 families in Kg Labak, Kinarut after receiving Rotary Disaster Relief Grant of RM15,000 which was matched by RM5,000 from a generous donor. Other items such as mattresses, pillows and towels were also donated.



My name is Ambaree and I am a member of Rotary Club of Marina City, Singapore. I am the Regional Chair for Environmental Protection, Singapore. I am also co-leading the South East Asian chapter of Environmental Sustainability Rotary Action Group, ESRAG.

My passion lies in spreading awareness and motivating people to pull up their socks to save what is left of our planet. One environmental

is a solution that I put maximum thrust in Plant Rich Diet (PRD). To reach maximum people within Rotary to adopt a Plant Rich Diet, we have formed an international task force under ESRAG, called the **Plant Rich Diet Task Force**. The PRD Task Force is a group of passionate individuals from around the world whose mission is to spread awareness about why Climate Change solutions MUST include addressing our current food habits and our unsustainable dependence on animal derived products meat, dairy, eggs, fish and seafood.

According to research, one of the most powerful steps anyone can take to massively reduce their own carbon footprint and the unbearable stress that our planet's natural resources are currently under, is to eat a diet rich in plants and low in animals. A global dietary shift towards whole grains, legumes, vegetables and fruits with less meat, dairy, eggs, fish and seafood is undeniably crucial if we wish to halt Climate Change.

Being the Co-Chair of the PRD Task Force and certified in Food Sustainability from eCornell, I have spoken at clubs and districts in the USA, Thailand, the Philippines, Malaysia, Singapore and Australia in the past months. We organised a 15 Day Plant Rich Diet Challenge in October 2021. We had over 550 participants from around the world and saw amazing success. For 15 days, we sent out daily emails with recipes, handy tips and research and hosted a stellar speaker series of 15 Scientists, Doctors, Cooking Enthusiasts and Media Personnels who spoke about the importance of a Plant Rich Diet.

I wish to continue speaking to Rotarians about sustainable eating and lifestyle to help them understand that the price of the food that we eat is not just the money we pay to buy it. There is a hidden price that our planet pays for our food and lifestyle choices, which we must take into account as environmentally conscious individuals.


