Dear Fellow Rotarians,

**FOURTH:** The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.


## THE FOUR-WAY TEST

The Four-Way Test is a nonpartisan and nonsectarian ethical guide for Rotarians to use for their personal and professional relationships. The test has been translated into more than 100 languages, and Rotarians recite it at club meetings:

Of the things we think, say or do

- 1. Is it the **TRUTH**?
- 2. Is it **FAIR** to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- 4. Will it be **BENEFICIAL** to all concerned?





#### GREETINGS, MY DEAR CHANGEMAKERS,



s we focus on membership in Rotary this month, I ask you to help make history this year. For more than 20 years, our membership has stood at 1.2 million. Rotary is a vibrant organization with a

116-year history, members in more than 220 countries and geographic areas, and a rich legacy of work in polio eradication and other humanitarian programs. Rotary has changed so much in our own lives and the lives of others. As we *Serve to Change Lives*, don't you think Rotary could have an even greater impact on the world if more people were practicing Service Above Self?

My vision is to increase Rotary membership to 1.3 million by July 2022, and the call to action is simple: Each One, Bring One. This year, I want every Rotarian and Rotaractor to introduce a new person into their club.

We are a membership organization, and members are our greatest asset. You are the ones who contribute so generously to The Rotary Foundation. You are the ones who dream big to bring good into the world through meaningful projects. And of course, you are the ones who have put the world on the brink of eradicating polio.

As we make membership a priority this year, let us focus on diversity by reaching out to younger people and especially to women. Every club should celebrate its new members, and every Rotarian who sponsors a member will be personally recognized by me. And those who are successful in bringing in 25 or more members will be part of our new Membership Society.

Even as we share the gift of Rotary with others, let us be sure to engage these new members, because an engaged Rotarian is an asset forever. And remember that engaging our current members and keeping them in our clubs is just as important as bringing in newcomers. Let us also be ready to form new clubs, especially flexible ones. I am very bullish on clubs that hold virtual or hybrid meetings, and satellite clubs and cause-based clubs can also be very effective ways of growing Rotary.

As you grow more, you will be able to do more. Let us keep empowering girls through our work in each of the areas of focus. Scholarships for girls, toilets in schools, health and hygiene education — there is so much we can do. Projects focused on the environment are also attracting interest the world over. Do participate in these projects locally and internationally to make this world a better place for us and for all species.

Each of you is a Rotary brand ambassador, and all of the wonderful work done by Rotarians around the world needs to be shared outside the Rotary community. Use social media to tell your friends, colleagues, and relatives the stories of Service Above Self.

Finally, I'm challenging every club, during the coming year, to plan at least one Rotary Day of Service that will bring together volunteers from inside and outside Rotary and will celebrate and showcase the work of your club in your community. 

However, participants came from 28 districts and there were also many non-Rotarians (from District 3310) who attended the session in order that they get to know what we do as Rotarians.

DG Dolly Yeap delivered her opening speech and followed by the introduction of the speaker which was done by PDG Andre Suharto, Chairman of District Learning & Development Committee.

The speaker is the country manager of Nuffnang Malaysia, Asia's leading digital influencer and contents marketing company. 

## DISTRICT PREVENTION OF BLINDNESS COMMITTEE REPORT

The purpose of the Rotarian Action Group for Blindness Prevention also known as RAGBP is to bring together, in fellowship and service:-

- Those Rotarians who have an active interest in the prevention of blindness and the promotion of eye health and vision worldwide.
- To provide both a platform and a forum to discuss ideas and develop appropriate cooperative programs to further our shared goals;
- And to promote international understanding and peace through common purpose and efforts.

In District 3310, the Prevention of Blindness Group was formed in Rotary Year 2003-04 during the Governorship of PDG David Tong. The inaugural Chairman was PP John SY Tan currently a member of RC of Tanjong Pagar. Previous to this Rotary Clubs carried out their Blindness Prevention activities on an adhoc basis under the Club Community Service Portfolio.

In District 3310 RC Singapore Heartlands has been conducting regular Eye Screening Activities Island wide. In a year we conduct at least 6 to 8 eye screening clinics. At each clinic we screen about 120 people during a four hours period. It is always held on a Sunday as our Doctors and nurses are only available on that day due to their regular work schedule.

These clinics are organized with the assistance of the Resident Committees of various constituencies. From statistics available during such clinics on an average 20 to 25 % of the participants are detected with some form of potential eye problems. They are given their individual reports which they can produce at any polyclinic of their choice for follow up and consultation.

With the onset of Covid-19 pandemic and the current strict restrictions in place it is impossible to conduct eye screening activities. However, we have our annual Eye Quiz for Interactors. It was shelved last year because of the tight restrictions imposed by the authorities due to Covid-19 outbreak. At this quiz is an Ophthalmologist will deliver a short lecture on the eyes and proper eye care methods. We hope that the message imparted during the presentation will be carried back by the students to their families and friends.

Another regular event in our calendar is the annual Inter District Conference titled: "SEEING EYE TO EYE" jointly organized by Districts 3310 and 3300. Each district alternates in organizing this event. This Rotary Year 2021-22 District 3310 will be the host.

This year's conference the 11th in the series titled: "SEEING EYE TO EYE - ASEAN AND BEYOND" will be organized by RC of Kota Kinabalu. It will be a virtual event and will take place on 10th October 2021. We have arranged an array of prominent speakers from overseas to deliver their papers.

Please block off the above date and support us as we try to eradicate Blindness from our society.

Our Clubs have also been active in promoting Blindness Prevention more so overseas. Rotary Club of Singapore is a champion in this field.

E-Club of 3310 has been active in conducting and assisting Cataract Surgeries overseas. Similarly, Clubs in East and West Malaysia have also been extremely busy in promoting Blindness Prevention activities within their communities.

Our activities require close interaction with the community and with the current restrictions we cannot move on with our activities.

Our eye screening services are popular in Housing Estates especially in the aging estates. Just for the information of members our experience with one such aging estate was an eye opener when we identified about 40% of participants with potential eye problems.

We are waiting anxiously for the COVID-19 pandemic to subside to go into action again.

The Equipment handover, that took place on 18 August 2021, was held outdoors at the Hospital's grounds and attended by the Hospital Chief and Senior Pediatric Doctors as well as Rotarians from RC Suan Chit Lada. 
#### 6 August – RC Batu Pahat "Maximizing of Impact on Public Image & Outreach"




