

#### **OBJECT OF ROTARY**

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

**FIRST:** The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

**SECOND:** High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

**THIRD:** The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;

**FOURTH:** The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

#### THE FOUR-WAY TEST

The Four-Way Test is a nonpartisan and nonsectarian ethical guide for Rotarians to use for their personal and professional relationships. The test has been translated into more than 100 languages, and Rotarians recite it at club meetings:

Of the things we think, say or do

- 1. Is it the **TRUTH**?
- 2. Is it **FAIR** to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- 4. Will it be **BENEFICIAL** to all concerned?



#### GREETINGS, DEAR CHANGEMAKERS OF ROTARY,

first discovered the value of service when I saw how a few simple acts can immeasurably change lives. It began when I joined others in my club for a project to bring toilets and clean drinking water to rural villages near our city. It moved forward when we promoted sanitation and provided opportunities for education across the country, thanks to generous gifts from supporters who believed in our projects as much as those of us on the ground did.

There is no better time of the year to be reminded of that generosity than November, which is Rotary Foundation Month.

As the charitable arm of Rotary International, The Rotary Foundation is the engine that powers so many Rotary projects throughout the world. The Foundation transforms your gifts into projects that change lives. It is the Foundation that helps us to get closer to our goal of eradicating polio, to show more people how we promote peace through tangible actions, and to demonstrate the impact our projects have in our areas of focus.

Consider some recent projects that were made possible by the Foundation:

- The Rotary clubs of Guatemala La Reforma, Guatemala, and Calgary, Alberta, received an \$80,000 global grant to organize a comprehensive plan to train nurses and rural health care workers to prevent and treat cervical cancer and to implement a sustainable system of referrals in seven regions of Guatemala.
- More than two dozen hospitals in Honduras received personal protective equipment for their medical staff thanks to a \$169,347 global grant sponsored by the

Rotary clubs of Villa Real de Tegucigalpa, Honduras, and Waldo Brookside-Kansas City, Missouri.

• The Rotary clubs of Cotonou Le Nautile, Benin, and Tournai Haut-Escaut, Belgium, received a \$39,390 global grant to provide agricultural training at an ecologically responsible permaculture mini-farm connected to a center for children in Sowé, Benin. This will help a new

generation of farmers become economically self-sufficient.

I like comparing The Rotary Foundation to the Taj Mahal, a monument of one man's love for a woman. The Foundation is a dynamic monument of our love for all of humanity.

This month I am asking all Rotary clubs to bring attention to the Foundation. It is what connects all Rotarians worldwide and transforms our


collective passions into projects that change lives. Visit **rotary.org/donate**; once there, you will have an opportunity to give directly to the program you're most passionate about.





Till we meet again. Take care.









# VOCATIONAL SERVICE PROJECT: INTER-CLUB VOCATIONAL DIALOGUE: "THE IMPACT OF WOMEN IN ROTARY"

#### THE PURPOSE AND INSPIRATION

Vocational Service, as CP Tengku Indra has always emphasised, is the Bedrock of Rotary. Our main objective is to lead through our vocation or profession to create a significant impact on the community, thus developing our leadership skills and inspiring others to do likewise or even better. Modern history has shown the powerful impact of not just world and business leaders but WOMEN in these fields; and the new ones are getting younger and younger. This is indeed an inspiring and positive transformation.

As a Rotarian still so new in this service organisation, PE Faridah, as the Vocational Service Director, was thus very honoured and excited to take up the challenge to lead and be the Moderator of this Inter-Club Dialogue.

This project aimed to highlight specifically, the impact of women in Rotary featuring Rotarian-Speakers from diverse backgrounds who shared stories of the amazing leadership and contributions made by the women Rotarians in their clubs.

This project was inspired by two outstanding women Rotarians in D3310. Firstly, by our very first woman District Governor, DG Dolly Yeap, who strongly urge for clubs to attract more people including women, especially those who care to serve the community, to join Rotary.

#### THE DIALOGUE MODEL

Our second source of inspiration is IPP Mona Manap who had pioneered a Vocational Service inter-club dialogue with a very interesting topic: "Rare Occupations", featuring a Forrester, amongst others. A similar model done before is the DVD: District Vocational Dialogue organised by the District Vocational Committee.

#### **SUMMARY OF THE DIALOGUE**

Overall, it was a very warm and highly energetic sharing of club stories, successes and specific women leaders' powerful contributions. Every speaker was remarkably eloquent and passionate in their sharing.

There were so many inspiring keypoints expressed by the Panelists.

- 1.The only gentleman in the Panel, **PP Foo**, highlighted RC Batu Pahat's Culture of Vibrance and Innovation: Supporting women and young women Rotarians' project ideas which could be very unusual but actually made an impact. Out of a large number of 130 members, 30% are women, and many of them are in leadership roles. The upcoming December project is the Virtual Dinner which has already raked in RM 700,000.
- 2.The youngest Panelist, **Rtn Reena** spoke of how the three women Presidents during their respective terms, capitalised on their established high-profile professions and networks to initiate, lead and made a marvellous impact on their targeted communities such as raising \$300,000 for the differently-able bodied beneficiaries. "A good Rotarian is a committed Rotarian. At the end of the day, it doesn't matter whether you are male or female." Also, the prominent factors are the women leaders' act of empowering others and their genuineness to inspire others including the Rotaractors and Interactors.
- 3. **IPP Mona** also affirmed that it is not your gender nor age but your sense of purpose and contributions that matter. The strengths of the club are in Trust and Mentorship: allowing fresh blood from diverse backgrounds to lead the way while not leaving them without any support and direction. Everyone is treated as equal. She spoke proudly of the Mini Library project for the rural children last year, inspired by CP Raja Noor who had initiated it and let others carry on while supporting it unobtrusively. Again, this point on using one's profession, network and knowledge on how to get government funds are of prime importance. Meanwhile, CP Raja Noor had just chartered the RC Sri Kenyalang another feather in the woman's cap.
- 4. Last but not least, **Rtn Roxana** spoke very fondly of RC KK Pearl's strongest asset: the all-women's club's female-bonding, support and mentorship. These are special attributes which make it fun and safe for the members to learn, lead and enjoy working together. The other distinct feature is that there are four mother-daughter teams where respect for each other can be gained. The outstanding activity is Project "R.E.A.L." has been very successful and popular in their effort at bridging the gap between the rural and urban children. The keypoint here is also how the women leaders in their high civil service positions are able to garner support from their relevant connections to gain the resources and funds, and thus create their productive and sustainable impact on their community.

The Q&A segment after the Dialogue was just as active and vibrant.

CP Tengku made his call-to-action to all clubs and especially Rotarians in attendance to conduct a similar Inter-Club Dialogue project.

On behalf of RCKG, PE Faridah thanked all Panelists, the Tech Host, DG Dolly Yeap who joined us during the later part of the event, all PDGs and attendees.


