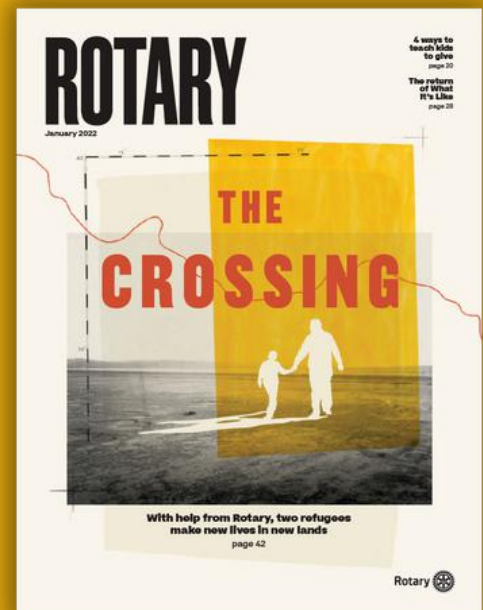

How was your New Year? I am sure all of you have had enjoyable festive celebrations and holidays as I did although the pandemic is still within our midst.

My Rotary journey in the past six months has been challenging yet meaningful because of you. You have made it so beautiful for me that in my heart there is your kindness, unselfish giving, unconditional love, and most important of all your strong belief in Rotary.

The monthly theme of Rotary is meant to highlight the wide range of Rotary's good work and give clubs some suggestions, and guidance for their programs and activities. The month of January is Vocational Service Month. Thank you to clubs that have organized webinar talks either physically or virtually and other programs during this month.

Thank you, my fellow Rotarians, for serving to SERVE TO CHANGE LIVES. We were able to undertake many projects and programs during these difficult times especially for those badly affected by the prolonged pandemic locally and internationally. I am happy to note that clubs are utilizing the D3310 COVID-19 Response Fund, and we had just announced PHASE 2 to allow clubs to obtain funding for the second time. The deadline for the submission is February 28, 2022.

Over the last six months, we have also been engaging constantly with clubs through several virtual pieces of training, seminars, including the launching of events and the constant series of webinar talks on the environment and other interesting issues. Several clubs have also been active in having their own webinar series. When the situation improved, I was invited by the clubs to join them in their physical activities taking place in some regions. This gave me the opportunity to travel and meet up with fellow Rotarians, their families, and friends of Rotary. I am now waiting for the earliest opportunity to visit clubs in Singapore.

I am pleased to see the steady growth in membership while the process of strengthening and reviving some weak clubs is ongoing over there. We are indeed led by Rotary International President Shekhar Mehta's guiding mantra "Do more and Grow more".

In recent weeks, we had conducted physically two membership fellowship events in Johor Bahru and Malacca respectively with Sarawak and Sabah immediately after the Chinese New Year. Singapore and Brunei will be organizing such an event too in the coming months.

I am also pleased to see improvements in the use of the Rotary marks of excellence. Congratulations Past District Governor Andre Suharto, Chairman of the District Training Team RY 2021-22, for being appointed as the one Training Leader to train the incoming governors of RY2022-23. It is indeed another proud moment for our District.





We have several activities and events coming up in the remaining 6 months of our Rotary year. On February 23, we will be celebrating International Day, On March 31st, an International Conference on Dengue Control will be held in Muar, a joint project with District 3300. The Organising Chair is PP Dr. Senthil Duraisamy. A hybrid International Conference on Girls Empowerment will be held in March under the Chairmanship of PP Dr. Datuk Tarsiah Taman. In April, we have the climbing of Mt. Kinabalu to be led by PP Dr. Ravi Mandalam.

In addition, there will be a DEI seminar chair by PDG Michael Yee, a Pan Borneo Meet in early May with RCKK Pearl as the host club and Rotarian Rosie Chong as the Organising Chair. And, as a final curtain, we will have the District Conference in late May to be jointly organized by RC Batu Bahat and RC Kulai with PP Foo Kok Hing as the Organising Chair and IPP Alex Qwee Co-Chairman.

Our Interact and Rotaract programs and projects involving girl's empowerment and other activities are progressing well with more to be rolled out in the coming months.

I wish every fellow Rotarians, friend of Rotary, partner, and potential member a Prosperous Lunar New Year, may the year of tiger brings happiness and wealth.

SECOND: High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

THIRD: The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;

FOURTH: The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

THE FOUR-WAY TEST

The Four-Way Test is a nonpartisan and nonsectarian ethical guide for Rotarians to use for their personal and professional relationships. The test has been translated into more than 100 languages, and Rotarians recite it at club meetings:

Of the things we think, say or do

1. Is it the **TRUTH**?
2. Is it **FAIR** to all concerned?
3. Will it build **GOODWILL** and **BETTER FRIENDSHIPS**?
4. Will it be **BENEFICIAL** to all concerned?

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

GREETINGS, DEAR CHANGEMAKERS OF ROTARY,

One of Rotary's founding principles was to use your vocation — whether as a doctor, lawyer, engineer, or another profession — to do good in the world. As we attempt to overcome and recover from the pandemic, this principle is vital in retraining people who have lost their jobs. In response, the Rotary E-Club of Tamar Hong Kong organized seminars for young people, with the aim of preparing them for the changing world of work.

This type of training must happen on a large scale. According to the United Nations, global unemployment is expected to exceed 200 million people in 2022. Women and youths are likely to be disproportionately affected.

This is why I've placed such a strong emphasis this year on projects that empower girls, and I've been delighted to see some of these projects in action. Of course, access to education and the path to employment can be blocked by a lack of water and sanitation infrastructure.

A project in Pune, India, focuses on providing girls and women with an affordable, reusable sanitary pad. The project provides employment for production and distribution of the pads, and it will reduce the pollution caused by the disposal of 12.3 billion sanitary napkins in the country annually, many of which end up in India's landfills.

Others have used vocational service to advance the empowerment of women. The Rotary Club of Poona, India, conducted workshops to teach martial arts to young women, for self-defense against the threat of abuse or human trafficking.

I've also been fortunate to use my vocation to do good through Rotary. The Indian Ocean tsunami in 2004 dev-

astated the Andaman and Nicobar Islands, which are part of my district. Thousands of homes were destroyed, and many areas lost electricity and running water. On my visit to Little Andaman Island, the builder in me immediately wanted to build homes for the homeless islanders there. We decided to construct 500 homes on Little Andaman.

On the last of my seven trips to the island, I could see something glimmering below as my helicopter was about to land. I realized that what I was seeing were the roofs of new homes. I was overjoyed by the sight, and soon a realization dawned upon me. As a builder I had built many beautiful buildings. In comparison, these 500 homes were the most ordinary buildings I had ever built, and they were in a place I likely will never visit again, for people I will never meet again. And yet the satisfaction I had in handing over these houses was greater than from anything I had previously built. Probably because for once I was using my vocation to *Serve to Change Lives*.

You, too, may have had opportunities to use your vocation to *Serve to Change Lives*. I welcome your stories of performing vocational service through Rotary. Also, I want to close by congratulating every club that has engaged with the Each One, Bring One initiative, which asks every member to introduce one person to Rotary. Increasing our membership gives people from all walks of life the opportunity to share their knowledge and skills in transformational service.

社長文告

各位親愛的改變者：

扶輪的創立原則之一就是運用你的職業——無論是醫師、律師、工程師，或是各種職業——在世界行善。在我們努力克服及走出疫情之際，這項原則在重新訓練失去工作的人就益形重要。因此，香港添馬 (Tamar Hong Kong) 網路扶輪社為年輕人辦理研討會，目的是要讓他們準備好因應改變的職場。

這種訓練必須大規模進行。據聯合國調查，2022 年全球的失業人口預計超過 2 億人。女性及年輕人受到影響的比例尤其高。

這就是我今年為何如此重視讓女孩增能的計畫，我很開心看到這樣的計畫在推展。當然，取得教育及工作可能受到缺乏水及衛生設施及基礎建設所阻礙。

印度普恩省一個計畫著重在提供女孩及女性可負擔、可重複使用的衛生棉墊。這個計畫提供棉墊的生產及運銷相關的工作，將減少該國每年所丟棄的 123 億片拋棄式衛生棉所造成的污染，其中許多最後都在垃圾掩埋場裡。

還有些人運用職業服務來促進女性增能。印度普納 (Poona) 扶輪社辦理工作坊，教導年輕女性學習武術，提升自衛能力，防範虐待及販賣人口的威脅。

我也有幸可以透過扶輪運用我的職業來行善。2004 年的南亞海嘯重創安德曼 (Andaman) 及尼科巴 (Nicobar) 群島，這是我地區的一部分。數千個家

園遭毀壞，許多地方失去電力及自來水。在我到小安德曼島 (Littel Andaman Island) 時，我內心的營造商魂立刻燃起，想要為當地流離失所的島民興建住所。我們決定在小安德曼島興建 500 間住宅。

我第七次、也是最後一次前往該島時，在我的直升機即將降落之際，我可以看到閃閃發亮的東西。我發現我看到的是新住宅的屋頂。這個景象令我開心不已，而且我也立刻瞭解到一件事。身為營造商，我蓋過許多美麗的建築。相較之下，這 500 間住所是我蓋過最平凡的房子，它們還是蓋在一個我可能再也不會前來的地方，為了我可能再也不會見到的人。然而，在移交這些房子時我的滿足感卻超過我之前興建過的任何東西。很可能是因為我頭一次運用我的職業來以服務改善人生。

同樣地，各位也有機會來運用你的職業以服務改善人生。我歡迎各位透過扶輪來進行職業服務的故事。此外，最後我想要表揚每個參與「一個帶一個」計畫的扶輪社，也就是讓每位社員介紹一個人加入扶輪。增加我們的社員讓各行各業的人都有機會可以把他們的知識及技能用在改變他人的服務。

Rotary's Woman Governor Self Challenge

RAISING FUND THROUGH MOUNTAIN CLIMBING TO PURCHASE VACCINES TO ERADICATE POLIO

She is 66 years old this year, a retiree, never climb any mountain before.

However she has decided to conquer the highest peak in Malaysia - Mount Kinabalu on 21-23rd April 2022. The purpose of her climb is to raise USD100,000 for End Polio Now Fund, for the purchase of Polio vaccines.

Today, Sin Chew Daily is going to introduce Ms Dolly Yeap, past president of Rotary Club of Kulai, and she has broken the past record being chosen to be the 1st woman governor in Rotary District 3310, since its establishment back in year 1990.

Dolly informed that she has attended the Governor Election for 4 times, and she did not succeed for the first 3 rounds. Finally she was chosen during her 4th attempt and becomes Governor in Rotary Year 2021-2022.

Dolly explained that Rotary District 3310 comprises a few areas, which include Johor, Melaka, Sabah, Sarawak, Labuan, Brunei and Singapore. In total, there are 72 Rotary clubs in this district.

Dolly admitted that Rotary clubs are dominated by male members all these while. With the encouragement and support from my club members, she has decided to take 1 step ahead-to participate in election for Governor position, in order to attract more female members to join Rotary to serve our community.

Dolly mentioned that Rotary Club provide various contributions to our community, including Haemodialysis Centre, Food aid during pandemic for needy family, and providing aid for single mothers.

Dolly believes that we can do more for our community when we grow our membership.

DOLLY YEAP: CLIMB THE STAIRCASES IN PREPARATION TO CLIMB MOUNT KINABALU

Dolly was nominated as the Chair of District End Polio Plus in year 2016, she vows to raise fund to eradicate Polio to ensure all children in this world is free from the harm of Polio. She explained that we are very close to our goal whereby there are only 2 remaining countries in this world which are still impacted by Polio, they are Afghanistan and Pakistan.

In order to achieve our goal faster, Dolly has launched limited edition End Polio watches (200 pcs) and wind brackets (1000 pcs). She has also accepted the suggestion of Past District Governor Datuk Zainie from Rotary club of Kota Kinabalu, to climb Mount Kinabalu to gear up fund raising for PolioPlus.

Dolly admitted to conquer Mount Kinabalu is a huge challenge to her—someone who does not have any mountain climbing experience. However, she is confident as she has about 10 rotary members who will climb together with her. The participants are very limited as we need to comply with SOPs.

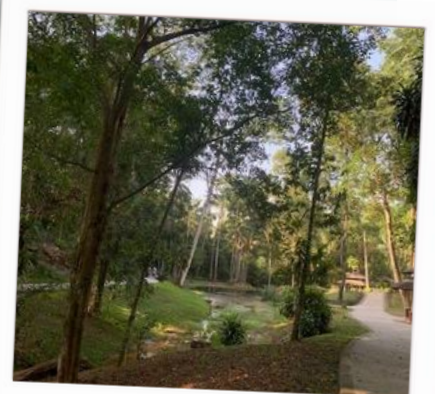
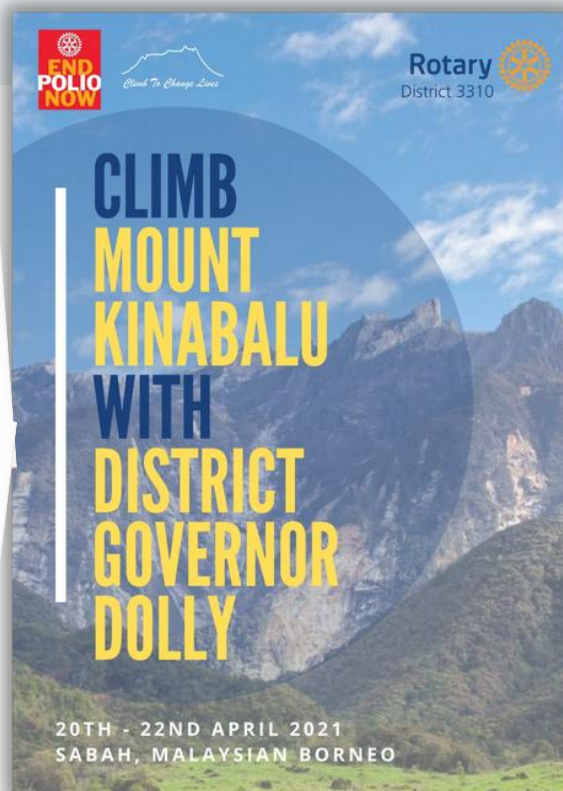
Dolly stated that she actually planned to train aggressively since June last year when she confirmed the climb. However, due to tight schedule to attend Rotary meetings nationwide, she has just finished 1 climb in Mount Pulai, Kulai.

She said with her current age of 66, it is indeed tough to launch this challenge, but she managed to make good use of limited time by climbing staircases.

Dolly explains that with her conviction to eradicate Polio worldwide, and with the imagination of the beauty Peak of Mount Kinabalu, these are the 2 motivations which drive her to face this challenge. She said this is something she can do for our children in this world, Hence, each and everyone support for this program is essential for us to achieve our fund raising goal.





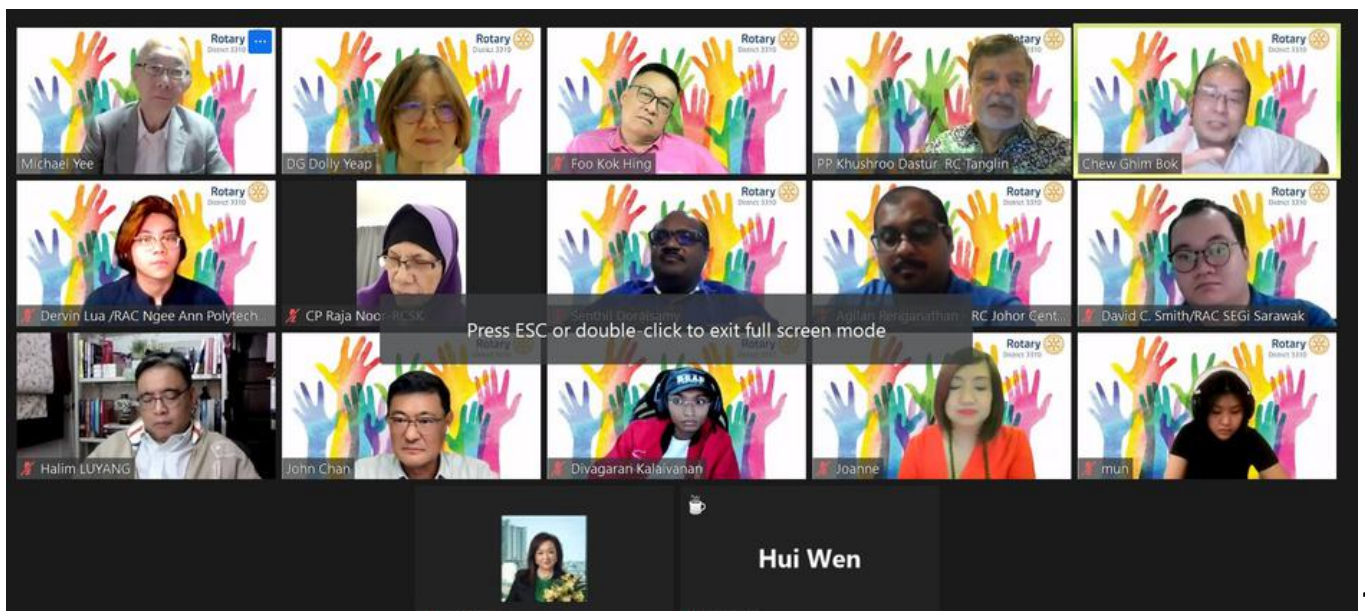

Thank you to everyone who participated in the 2022 Council on Legislation (COL) vetting process, which took place online from 15 November to 31 December 2021. In accordance with subsection 7.070.6. of the RI Bylaws, representatives and clubs in the District considered 39 enactments as below:

- Enactments with 419 or more votes for Support will be considered on the consent agenda for the 2022 COL.
- Enactments with 419 or more votes for Oppose will be considered rejected by the Council and will not be considered further.
- Enactments that receive less than 419 votes for Support and Oppose will be considered at the 2022 COL meeting.

Rotary International reported that three items received greater than 419 votes in support and zero items received greater than 419 votes in opposition. The three items that will be adopted are:

Council Number	Title	Total Support	Total Oppose
22-54	To publish the RI budget and annual report on the Rotary website	433	41
22-61	To eliminate inconsistencies in the RI Bylaws	459	16
22-84	To allow Rotaractors to attend Rotary club meetings	426	45

Since these three items will be considered as adopted at the 2022 COL meeting, there will be no debate on these items at the COL meeting and they will be removed from the order of items to be considered. As the remaining 36 items received fewer than 419 votes in support or opposition, they will continue to be considered in the normal order of consideration at the 2022 COL.

New Legislation

After the legislation book was published, the RI Constitution and Bylaws Committee reconsidered two items proposed by clubs and districts. They found the items to be regular. These items have been added to the legislation book on My Rotary:

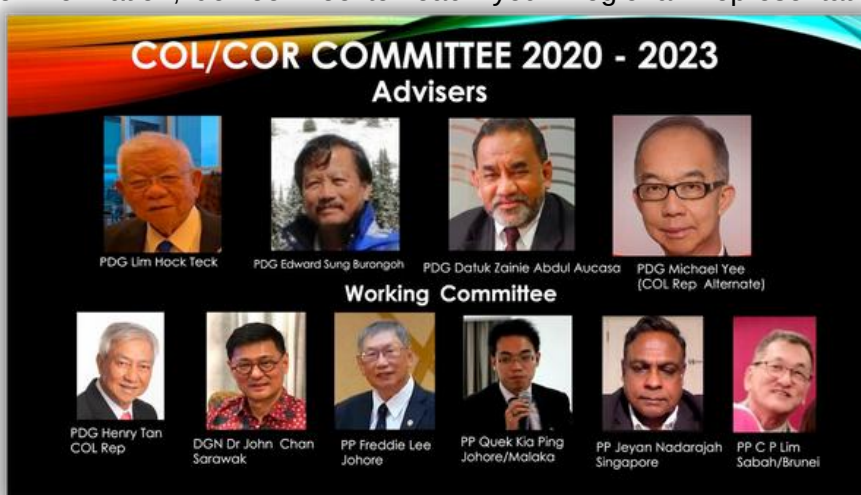
- 22-93, To set qualifications and a compensation limit for the general secretary
- 22-94, To provide for a New Generations Service Exchange Committee

Since these items are being published after the deadline, RI has invited submissions for statements of support and opposition to RI by 31 January 2022. All submissions required to be passed, by clubs and districts, in order to submit statements on these two items only. However, due to the limited time available to process this, the District was not able to make any submission.

The COL working team like to thank all our clubs for their support and responding to the COR and COL affairs. If you have any questions about the information, do feel free to reach your Regional Representatives for assistance.

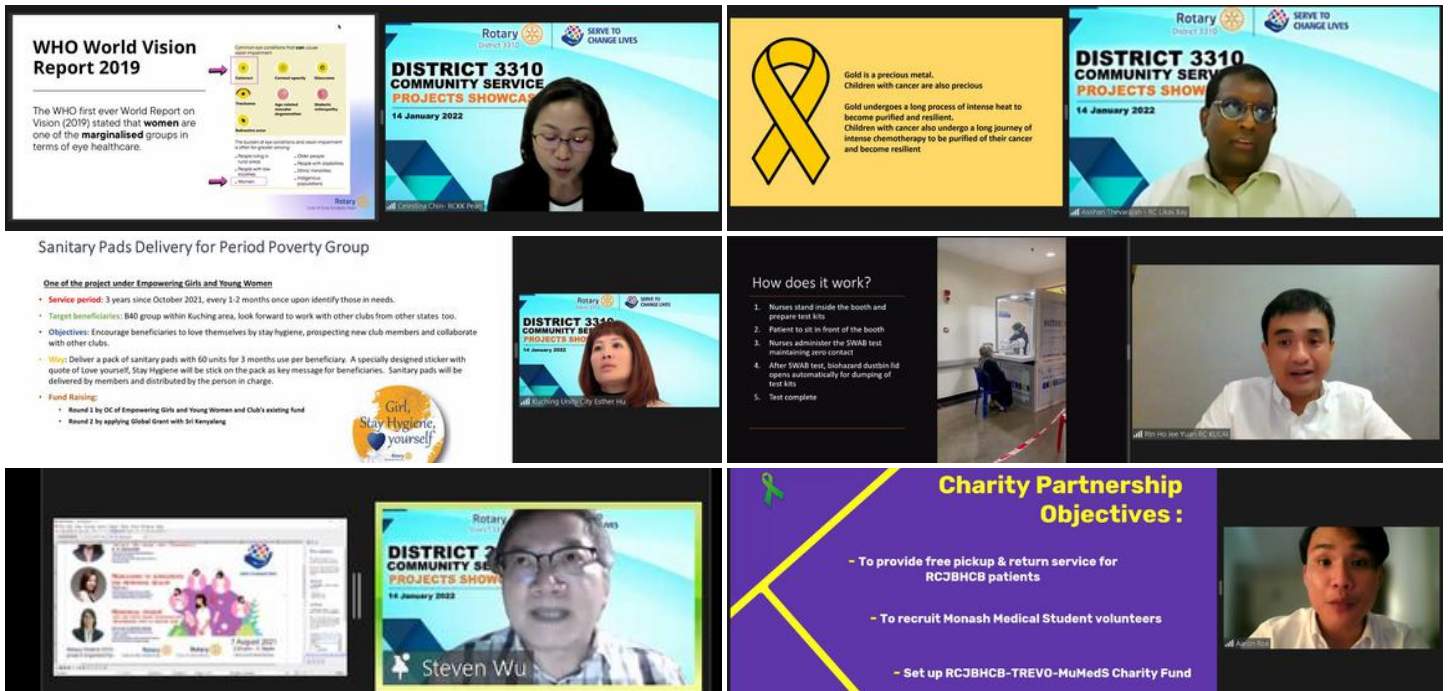


District Event

The Rotary Club of Raffles City (RCRC) is undertaking two significant community service projects:

Project 1: Gladiolus Place

RCRC is supporting the ongoing renovation of current facilities of the Gladiolus Place, with the cost estimated at SG\$1.8 million, of which SG\$1.4 million is funded by the Singapore government, and the balance to be raised through donations.

Gladiolus Place was founded in 1998, and is one of three all-girls homes, reaching out to vulnerable youths (age 11-16) in need of care and protection, and who are facing or at risk of abuse, neglect, delinquency and wayward behaviours. The Ministry of Social & Family Development assesses each case, and where residency at home or with relatives is not appropriate, the youth is received by Gladiolus Place.

Through the healing and renewal processes they undergo during their stay, Gladiolus Place seeks to restore these young females to their families and communities as transformed individuals.

The government provides about 50% support of the operating costs, with the balance coming from donations. Currently, Gladiolus Place has 27 residents.

RCRC is looking to support this effort through a charity film show.

Project 2: Critical Vocational Skills Development as empowerment for “At Risk” Girls in Siem Reap, Cambodia

RCRC has also embarked on a project to assist “at risk” female youth in Siem Reap through vocational skills development in collaboration with LJ Cambodia Foundation as well as Build Bright University, government agencies and Angkor Children Hospital, with the objective of reducing human trafficking and exploitation.

The key areas of skills will be supported with lessons in entrepreneurship and basic first aid. The aim is for these female youth to find opportunities to apply what they have learnt to develop programs to create a small business or as a village cooperative to support livelihoods in the village.

This project is supported by the following Rotaract Clubs in Singapore:

1. **Rotaract Club of Raffles City (Health Poverty; sewing of masks and sanitary pads);**
2. **Rotaract Club of Singapore West (Nutrition Poverty; farm vegetables and fish);**
3. **Rotaract Club of Bukit Gombak (Hunger Poverty; rear chicken);**
4. **Rotaract Club of Singapore (Nursing students)**

The total cost of the project is budgeted at US\$64,000. RCRC is in the process of looking for other Rotary Clubs and private donors globally to participate in this project. The donors can either give a cash contribution or tap into their District Designated Fund (DDF). **Details can be found in the Rotary International Global Grant 2229879.**

Did you know that Pangolins have become the **WORLD'S MOST TRAFFICKED MAMMALS?**


These gentle and shy animals who are a victim of wildlife animal abuse have a critical ecological role to play in our environment. They provide the earth with all-natural pest control and are fantastic tenders of soil, and they do these things simply through their everyday behaviors.


It is estimated that a single pangolin consumes as many as 70 million insects per year, mainly ants and termites.

However, due a steep decline in their population due to illegal trafficking in the past few years, they have been declared an endangered species. If pangolins go extinct, there would be a cascading impact on the environment.

If you are curious about these toothless, solitary and nocturnal creatures, their contribution in maintaining an ecological balance and how they impact life on earth, then join us at an event dedicated to the Pangolins!!

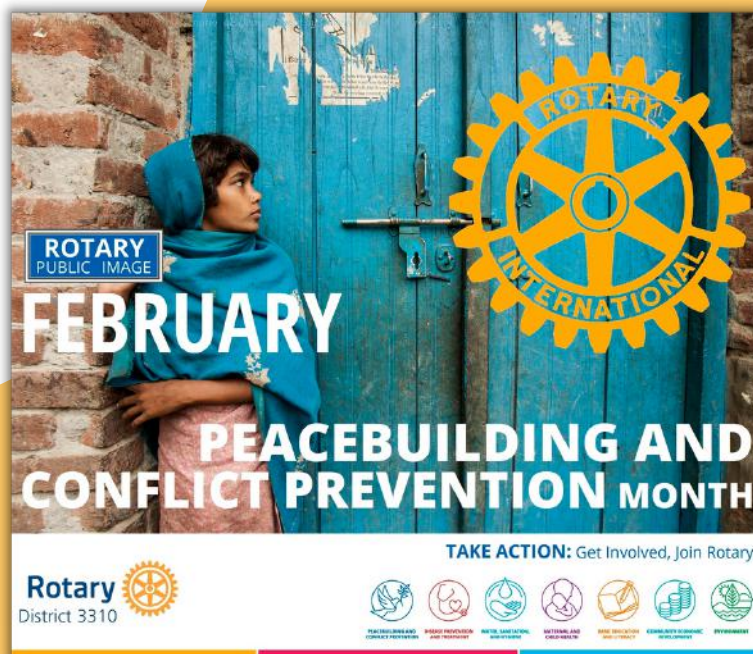
