THIRD: The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;

FOURTH: The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

THE FOUR-WAY TEST

The Four-Way Test is a nonpartisan and nonsectarian ethical guide for Rotarians to use for their personal and professional relationships. The test has been translated into more than 100 languages, and Rotarians recite it at club meetings:

Of the things we think, say or do

1. Is it the **TRUTH**?
2. Is it **FAIR** to all concerned?
3. Will it build **GOODWILL** and **BETTER FRIENDSHIPS**?
4. Will it be **BENEFICIAL** to all concerned?

It has been so exciting to see Rotary members come together at the presidential conferences to share ideas about using our areas of focus to bring about big, lasting change in the world. The past and upcoming


presidential conferences are looking at our new area of focus — the environment — and how our work to protect our planet must also support our efforts to grow local economies, especially in places with the greatest poverty.

We must find ways to protect our planet while sustaining the economic growth necessary to achieve our highest humanitarian goals.

This is a very exciting time in Rotary, a time when the world needs us most. As we *Serve to Change Lives*, remember that we are also changing ourselves. We are becoming the world's great change-makers and peace-builders.



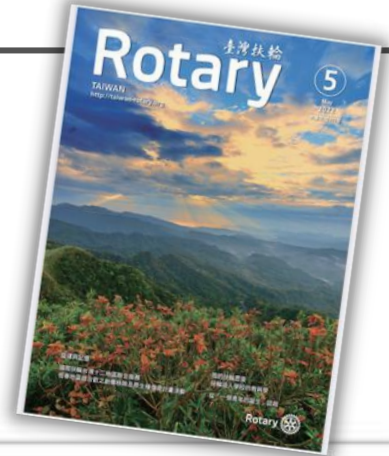

GG 2016401 provided funding for 20 hemodialysis machines for a Rotary Hematology Centre in Kolkata, India. The target beneficiaries are those living below the poverty line from the rural areas in Kolkata. Treatment is provided free of charge. The 20 Dialysis Machines are located over 2 floors, with the water management unit located at the rooftop of the building. The Centre also acted as a logistic storage centre for the Covid-19 vaccines for distribution to the various vaccination centres in the city. The Rotary infrastructure also came into good public health assistance to combat Covid-19 in India. Special thanks to PP Jimmy Cheung (RC Chang) and PP Sami Hong (RC TzuCheng, Taiwan) for their strong support for this GG. Many thanks as well to all members of RC Singapore and to District 3310. RC Delhi West led the delegation from DRFC that includes DRFC Dr and Mrs. Shahul married as well as Mr and Mrs. Peter Brade to Kolkata on 8 March 2022.

Support Our Seniors

It is projected that by 2030, 1 in 3 Singaporean will be a senior above the age of 60 years. While there are many on-going projects initiated by the government for this group of seniors, these projects deal mainly with matters of finance, housing and health of the elderly. Rightly so! But there are also many social issues that impact the elderly.

Questions that come to mind include the following:

1. How can we keep an elderly population engaged and active?
2. How can the elderly share their wisdom and experiences in the family and the community?
3. How can they communicate with the younger generations and vice versa?
4. How can they overcome loneliness?

The RCMS has identified some ways to help the elderly cope, as they transit into this new phase of their lives.

Promote Intergeneration Communications and Interactions

Here we want to create the opportunity and encourage the elderly to relate to the younger generations through stories and experiences. We have plans to build a library of short video clips and photos of 'old Singapore' that can serve as conversational topics.

The club has so far prepared six video clips that are available on u-tube as resource to generate discussions. These covered places like the Kallang Gasworks, the Yan Kit swimming Complex, Outram Park, Raffles Place, National Theatre and the Peoples Park in Chinatown.

A calendar with photographs of old Singapore was also printed, bringing the concept to the homes.

Singapore Memories/ Nostalgic Singapura Workshops and Webinar Sessions

We would conduct workshops, exhibitions and webinars so that seniors can get together to share their own stories relating to historical and old landmarks. This is healthy environment for discussions and reminiscence among friends, colleagues and family members. "Down memory Lane" sessions can also be conducted.



We have conducted talks and webinar session based on this concept. Participants shared their experiences and stories freely and it was well received. We hope to do more sessions in the future. The Rotary Eldercare Centre had invited us to conduct such sessions as part of their reach-out program.

“My Personal Experience” and “My Personal Treasure” Series

We want to encourage the seniors to script their own stories or experiences based on a physical location or a physical items or artifacts that they treasure. RCMS will help them to post on sites that they like to share with like face-book, tik toc or others.



“My Stories, My Roots” workshop

RCMS conduct workshops to encourage seniors to pen and write short stories about their lives so that they can pass down to their next generations for posterity. We show the way to organize and compile into handy books to be present to their family members on occasions like anniversaries. So far, the club had conducted 3 sessions.



“Managing Loneliness” Workshops

RCMS plans to organize workshops and webinars to talk about the subject of ‘loneliness’ as we foresee this as a potential social problem of the future.

Planning for the future

Getting old is a natural process; yet it is necessary to plan ahead and anticipate the community needs. These issues cannot be solved with money alone. It requires the human touch and the sensitivity so as to ensure the dignity of the elderlies.

With these programs RCMS hopes to play a significant role in the community of the future.

流動櫃檯，雖然空間不大，但驗眼器材和眼鏡專櫃等一应俱全，5個小時內可為至少80名學生進行驗眼的服務。

除此之外，該社也準備了120副眼鏡，免費提供給那些來自貧窮家庭的学生，以減輕他們的負擔。

2. 麻雀虽小、五臟俱全，流動櫃檯的設備一點都不馬虎。

巴西古當華揚扶輪社是於今日上午在Eko Flora花園舉辦捐血活動及移交驗眼流動櫃檯的儀式。該社社長黃振亮透露，驗眼流動櫃檯的工作籌備了6個月，耗資約1萬5000令吉。

他指出，推動驗眼服務的想法，是源自於接獲一些教師的反映，指學生回校上課後，無法清楚看到黑板上的文字，進而影響學習進度。

他透露，這些有視力問題的学生，相信是在疫情期間長期接觸電子產品如電腦和平板等，導致近視或散光的情況。

“當學生有視力問題時，尤其是小学生無法表達視力出現模糊，家長也不一定察覺得到，因此我們希望可以通過與學校配合，在校園為學生提供免費驗眼服務。”

他表示，他們會優先考慮城市以外地区的學校，因為郊区可能比較缺乏驗眼的中心；流動櫃檯的第一站預計會於4月底在古來縣的四維華小進行。

曾榮賢：辦講座教育保護眼睛

捐獻驗眼流動櫃檯的Infinity Optical眼鏡公司董事曾榮賢也是巴西古當華揚扶輪社的社員。他表示，除了協助驗眼，他們也希望通過講座，教育父母如何與孩子一起保護眼睛。

他指出，佩戴眼鏡雖然可以減緩視力問題，但是也要改善平時的習慣，例如調整家中燈光、閱讀或觀看的姿勢，以及不要長時間使用眼力等。

其中一位家長謝女士（46歲，家庭主婦）就認為，免費驗眼流動櫃檯是一項很好的服務，對於家長和學生來說相當方便。

她說，若能趁學生還小時就發現視力問題，相信就比較容易改善。

他透露，目前捐血程序會依照標準作業程序，包括施打冠病疫苗後可以捐血，以及冠病染疫後輕症或無症狀者，康復後14天之後即能捐血等。

Uniqlo Clothes of Love



The Rotary Club of Kuching Central has collaborated with Uniqlo Malaysia for the fourth year on a variation of their 'Clothes of Love' project. The first part saw the project partners donate brand new apparel and colouring kits to 34 children under the care of SOS Kids Kuching, an NGO to assist children who are in and out of the Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU) at Sarawak General Hospital (except those with cancer). As we were unable to visit the children personally due to the strict SOP with regards to their health conditions, a simple ceremony was organized to handover the items to President Evelyn and representatives of SOS Kids, witnessed by Mr. Marfizzal, the manager of the Uniqlo Aeon Kuching branch. Each child's colouring kit also had a 'Note of Love' affixed with a handwritten message prepared by Rotarians, Uniqlo staff, Rotaractors, Interactors, and family members to send some positivity and motivation, despite being unable to meet physically. RC Kuching Central is also working with the SOS Kids committee to explore how we can support the children in other ways.



The next part of 'Clothes of Love' project was carried out with the donation of over 400 pieces of new Uniqlo apparel to the Salvation Army Children's Home. It was another simple handover to Captain Raymond and witnessed by Major Francis Ng of the Salvation Army. The RC Kuching Central members were joined by guests from the Church of Latter Day Saints, as they were also keen to see how they could work with the club on further projects. The final phase of the project is currently being finalized and will take place in May.

Books of Hope

Approximately 1500 books were donated to 3 primary schools in Siburan, which is about 40 kilometres outside Kuching on the 13th of April as part of the Books of Hope 3.0 project. This was a joint project organized by RC Kuching Central together with the Rotaract Club of Swinburne Sarawak and the Swinburne Sarawak Library. Books were also brought in from Swinburne's Melbourne campus.

This is the 3rd time the project has been implemented with about 5200 books donated to 5 primary schools in Serian and Kuching in 2018 and 2019. Rotarians and Rotaractors worked together to identify primary schools whose libraries were in need of additional or new books. They then purchased the books or collected the donated ones before sorting and packing them.



As the current SOPs do not allow for activities with the students unlike the previous 2 iterations of this project, 'Notes of Love' posters were designed for each class in all 3 schools instead. Rotarians, Rotaractors, lecturers and the staff of the Swinburne Library wrote simple messages in these posters to motivate the beneficiaries to continue reading and learning. During the simple but meaningful handover ceremonies at each school, the principals expressed their surprise and happiness at the number of books received, as well as the encouraging messages.

Besides handing over the books, the organizing committee and the Swinburne librarians spoke to the various teachers in charge of the school libraries to identify any possible needs and challenges they may be facing. This information will be used to plan the final phase of the project, where the clubs will work with the Swinburne Sarawak Library to provide free training for these teachers to help them manage their libraries more efficiently in order to promote reading and learning amongst the primary school children.

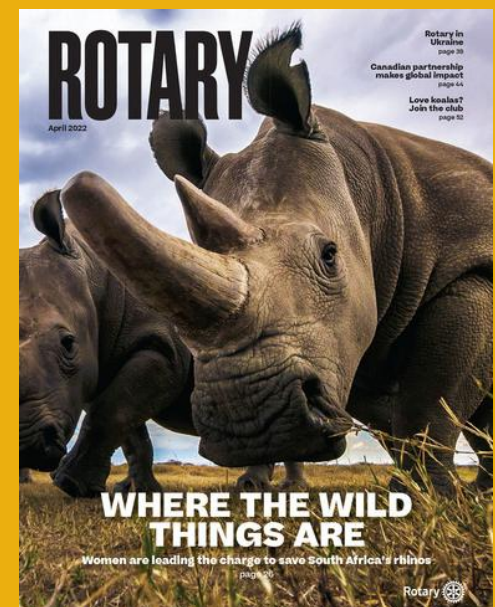
