21/07/22 - RC Kota Famosa together with OCBC Bank Malaysia, Melaka Branch had carried out and completed the refurbishment of the Tebong Estate Tamil Primary School (SJKT Ladang Tebong) located approximately 45km from Melaka town. The school received new story books, bookshelves, 2 computers with peripherals, an air-conditioner in the library and a PA system for the school hall. 



Since 1988, Rotary and our partners have immunized nearly 3 billion children against polio. As of June 2021, Rotary had committed more than \$2.2 billion to global polio eradication. We're still working to eliminate the wild poliovirus in the last two countries where it remains endemic and to ensure that it does not return elsewhere. In 2020-21, program awards, including PolioPlus Partners grants, totaled \$152.9 million.

26/07/22: While the road to eradication remains challenging, we have the necessary tools to #EndPolio for good. We must continue to reach every last child with polio vaccines to maintain the incredible progress we've made towards a polio-free world. https://t.co/X67ybflwfn

As Rotary members, it is critical that we ramp up our efforts to raise awareness for the importance of reaching all children with polio vaccines, and continue raising the funds necessary to carry out critical eradication activities to protect vulnerable children and prevent further outbreaks. The push to end polio in our District 3310 has been activated through a healthy fund raiser Step Up to End Polio in commemoration of World Polio Day on 24 October 2022.
