Avoidable Blindness Committee

The following brief report of the recently concluded ABXtra09 programme on 28 March is appended for your information:

"ROTARY CAN SEE....."

Rotarians of Singapore (D3310) commemorated the first seven years of involvement, service and contribution to their community service in the prevention of avoidable blindness

The object of the ABXtra09 programme for the community on 28 March 2009 was to educate and create an awareness of the needs to regularly check the eyes

Singapore is well known world-wide for being highly myopic, as myopia affects 80% of population by the time they reach 18 years of age.

The AB Extravaganza Programme 2009 on 28 March held activities of sight and eye evaluation for kids (SEEK) and a beautiful eyes contest (HBE) for 7-12 year olds and a Healthy Eyes Symposium for parents. Later in the day, an EYE QUIZ was held for 150 students of 13-17 years of age followed by a Eye Care Forum by eye specialists directed to parents and teachers.

The programme received the support of three Members of Singapore Parliament as guests of honour. Rounding up, some 400 Rotarians, eye specialists, prize winning students and parents, friends enjoyed the Commemorative Dinner graced by the District Governor and three succeeding Governors in the District. The presence of HE the Ambassador of Mexico to Singapore; who himself is partially impaired in vision marked the significance of the event...

Dr Edwin Chow, a research scientist of A*STAR, Singapore's top scientific agency delivered the special dinner guest talk on the "Latest Ophthalmic Research Findings".

The Chairman of the District AB Committee, PP John S Y Tan spoke on "Avoidable Blindness - Rotary can see...." In his speech he urged all Rotarians to be more aggressive in organising forums and eye screening clinics for the community as more and more people in the world are being inflicted with blindness that are treatable and preventable

Moving on; the RC of Singapore continues their 'Care for the Elders" project to eye screen 100 old folks at the Ling Kwan Home in Serangoon Gardens on 19 April whilst many of us are at the District Assembly in Melaka, discussion Rotary's continuing contribution in avoidable blindness

Put a dot in your time schedule for 16 May and join the RC Serangoon Gardens Orchard in their "Forum cum Eye Screening" of 300 residents of the Ang Mo Kio constituency. The MP Mr. Inderjit Singh is the Guest of Honour.

On June 7, the RC Tangkat Ledang with the sister Club RC Victoria will conduct eye checks for the villagers of "Bekoh orang asli village". 15 mins away from Tangkat town

membership data available

Club and district leaders have seven new reports available to them via Member Access. The new reports give leaders access to helpful club and district membership data.

The Clubs in District report allows leaders to view a list of active clubs in their district. The New Rotary Clubs and Terminated Clubs by District reports show a list of new and terminated clubs for a given date range,

The Club Member Count by Country and Geographic Area report shows the number of Rotary club members by country or area. Leaders can get gender-specific stats for their district by viewing the Women by District report and worldwide with the Women by Country and Geographic Area report.

Leaders can also use the 5-Year Membership History report to view membership records for clubs in their district.

The View Membership Data report is still available in addition to the seven new reports. To access these reports, log in to Member Access and click on "Review Membership Trends" or "Review Club Data" in the navigation menu.
