

Hello my Fellow Rotarians,

When I was in Kuching last weekend to attend the Membership Seminar, two fellow Rotarians asked me "DG when is your next letter from the desk?" I was pleasantly surprised. They seemed eager wanting to know what is coming next... wanting to know more.

At that moment, I felt like writing one immediately. However, the whole of last week, apart from other commitments, I was busy attending several Rotary meetings, namely the 21st District Conference Organizing Committee, the DG's Newsletter Editorial Board, the Joint Presidents Meeting of Group 13 which includes discussions on the forthcoming Rotary Foundation Seminar and the Walk for Eradication of Polio. All committees were reporting excellent progress. I am glad that I was able to meet up with them before I begin with my lengthy club visits in a week time. I am very proud to be associated with these friends working tirelessly silently behind the scene.

As mentioned in my last letter, the 13th August Saw Kalimah and I participated in two Rotary events, one the launching of the Rotary Community Corp project in Kampong Teringai, a remote village in Sabah and the other is the Installation occasion of the Rotary Club of Raffles City, Singapore.

At precisely 6.40 am, with Rotarian Grant Colbron at the wheel and PP Richard Barrow at the bodyguard seat, both my club members, we drove out of Kota Kinabalu to begin the 2hours 30 minutes journey to Kg. Teringai. Had it not be for the fasting, we would have made the traditional several stops for "breakfasts" before reaching the project site. Despite my insistence for breakfast stop at our usual shop in Tuaran for my two friends to grab some food, they politely refused. We arrived at the village on the dot at 9.30 am

AG Rustom was so kind to pick us up at the airport and straight to the Installation venue, 1 Degree 15, where we were met upon arrival by President Aaron Tan and Organizing Chair Thomas Graf. After a quick shower, we arrived at the hall just in time for the commencement of the function. It was an elegant event with a theme "What One Person Cannot Do Alone, We Can Achieve Together". We witnessed the installation of President Aaron Tan and his team of dedicated Rotarians as they "Reach Within to Embrace Humanity". After several inspiring speeches and the "mandatory" group photo sessions we were serenaded with several unchanged melodies by amongst others, the ever popular PP George Abraham and PP Ronald Pereira. My wife and I truly enjoyed ourselves. It was a great evening of excellent fellowship. Thank you President Aaron and to all our friends in the RC of Raffles City.

Last weekend on the 20th August we had another Membership Seminar and this time in Kuching, hosted by the Rotary Club of Kuching Central. It was again a great success with



Rotarians from as far as Brunei, Kuala Beliat, Miri, Bintulu and Sibu who joined their fellow Rotarians from Kuching for an eventful day of Rotary sharings followed by a great evening where the many achievements of Rotary were showcased to our spouses and invited guests, many of whom are potential members. PP Ravi Velu carried the occasion extremely well. I joined the many in congratulating PP Alex Eow, President Juergen Ertl and the Organizing Chairman PP Kho Ping and his hard working team and all members of the Rotary Club of Kuching Central for having hosted such a splendid event. The Organizing Chair Rotarian Maria Boey has invited me to give a welcoming address at the launching of the Singapore Breaking Record of Re-cycled Can Sculpture event on the 11th September at 9.30am at the same venue. I hope to see many of you and your family there to support this event.

In my coming letters, I would be giving prominence to some of the forthcoming District



level projects to garner stronger support and participation from all of you with the objective of making our District better coordinated, stronger and vibrant.
