- 10.40 am: Ms Saleemah Ismail, United Nations Women
 - Saleemah shares the impact of Social Inclusion and Economic Empowerment programmes based on her working experience with UN agencies and UN Women. She has worked closely with migrant women and families, through AIDHA, and incarcerated women and children via New Life Stories. Saleemah was co-chair of Anti-trafficking Committee for UN Women and remains a key driver in the anti-trafficking civil society.
- 11.00 am: Nidhi Swarup, Crohns & Collitis Society of Singapore Nidhi founded the Crohns & Collitis Society of Singapore after suffering from the auto immune disease herself. Now, other patients have an avenue of support. CCSS will soon launch a "Can't Wait" card, that allows patients suffering from inflammatory bowel disease to jump queues to use public toilets.
- 11.20 am: Sumitra Debi, Sutattoo Rebuilding lives with Nipple Tattoo Reconstruction
 - Breast cancer is the most common cancer for women here. Although more than half of them have a mastectormy, the general public's awareness of breast, nipple and areola reconstruction and tattooing remains low. Ms Sumitra Debi is the only professional tattoo artist in Singapore who does nipple tattoo reconstruction. She will share about the latest 3D tattoo technology and how it helps breast cancer patients gain back their confidence
