Recommendations on the Induction Procedure

Joining a Rotary club should be a momentous occasion for a new member. It is very important that the ceremony to induct a new member be marked with some formality

- 1. Family plays a key role in Rotary and as such family members should be invited for the Induction ceremony
- A mentor should be assigned for the new member before the ceremony and identified during the ceremony
- 3. Prior to the induction, the President or the sponsor should talk to the new member about prospects of serving on a committee and establish his desired interest.
- 4. Try and invite a Rotary senior to grace the occasion, particularly if two or more are being inducted. It could be DG, PDG, District Chair, etc.
- 5. Along with the Pin the new Rotarian should be presented with "New Member Welcome Kit" and a copy of "Introducing New Members to Rotary: An Orientation Guide". Both are available from shop.rotary.org for USD 4.95 and USD1.25 respectively. The Club should purchase a few copies and keep them on hand.
- 6. Also insert in the folder, a brief history of your club, current Board Member names/contact details and any

- other club data that would be useful for the new member.
- 7. Inductee to be briefed on ceremony procedure before hand
- 8. Attire should be formal to reflect the importance of the occasion
