October District Governor's Message

Dear fellow Rotarians and Rotaractors,



We are now entering the second quarter of our Rotary year. No doubt, the first quarter was challenging as we all made good efforts to implement the brilliant ideas we had planned at the District, club and personal level. The first few months of my term have been extremely rewarding as I continue to visit clubs virtually to see all the marvellous work Rotarians do across our District and also to learn how our clubs operate. I hope you are equally as proud and carry a sense of satisfaction that you are putting your best foot forward.

By the end of September I have visited 30 out of 72 clubs virtually. I learned of projects of various scales. No matter the size, each project done or planned has left an indelible mark on me. It is truly amazing to witness first-hand the outstanding projects that we do. We need to make every effort to better promote our good work so that more people will come to know about Rotary and come forward to lend their support. The more help we get, the better able we are to address the needs of the communities where we live.

Rotary has designated the month of October for **Economic and Community Development**. It highlights one of our six Areas of Focus and may be the one that probably gets the least attention in our District. The COVID-19 pandemic would have brought about sluggish economies, high levels of unemployment and rising poverty in our District and beyond. As Rotarians, we should all be concerned with these trends and think of ways that we can help. Is there something that we can do to help spur income generation and savings? Can we develop projects that will help with job creation and entrepreneurship? What if we were to, as Rotarians, engage other community and business leaders as well as stakeholders in the public and private sectors to work together to develop and implement such initiatives? We are now presented with an opportunity to revisit the classification lists in our individual clubs to identify those members with the skills best suited for economic development and get them engaged. I have no doubt we will be able to come up with amazing solutions.

World Polio Day is on 24 October, and it is the greatest opportunity we have to raise funds and awareness for Rotary's polio eradication efforts. Visit endpolio.org/worldpolioday to get tools for planning virtual events and fundraisers, and to register your club's event. My heartfelt thanks goes out to the various clubs and individual Rotarians participating and who have contributed to the Step Up to End Polio donation drive. To date, we have raised US\$36,000. However we are far short of the target of US\$100,000 and I encourage those who have not participated in the donation drive to come on board and consider making a donation of any amount to the End Polio Now fund, which will be matched 2-to-1 by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. In the face of a pandemic, there is a serious risk of further spread of polio. Your support is more important than ever, and it will ensure that together we can tackle the remaining obstacles and achieve a polio-free world.

So let us make October a month to remember. During this month, I will continue to visit clubs and meet as many Rotarians virtually as possible. My experience has been exciting and I look forward to meeting and engaging with more of you. Let us continue to develop and implement service projects in our clubs to benefit our communities. It is important that all members are engaged to use their talents and vocations for the maximum effect of opening opportunities. Now is the time to come forward and offer yourselves for service. 

For Rotary Year (2020 - 2021)





Setting Goals on Rotary Club Central & Citation

It has been customary and an ongoing tradition that Rotary International recognizes Rotary Clubs in the District for their outstanding contributions during the Rotary year by awarding clubs with a Rotary citation.

The award of the Rotary Citation involves fulfilling a set of goals set out by the respective Rotary Clubs by the end of the Rotary year. These goals relate to 5 areas of Rotary – Members & Engagement, Rotary Foundation Giving, Service, Young Leaders and Public Image. The good news is that Presidents and members of Rotary Clubs do not really have to go out of their way to achieving these Citations.

Understanding the Rotary Citation 2020-21

The Rotary Citation for 2020-21 is substantially different in concept and process from prior Citations. It is

not expected that there will be an "achievement guide" or "how-to" page on the Rotary.org website. This guide should provide a quick understanding of how to qualify for the Rotary Citation in 2020-21. Here are the important things to know:

This Citation has **no fixed or minimum achievement criteria**.

To qualify, your club must set and achieve its **own goals** in **13** of 25 Goal Categories (half of the categories).

You may select categories important to you and set your target level of achievement in each.

Achievements in each category must be entered by the club in Rotary Club Central, except for Membership, Annual Fund and PolioPlus contributions which will be updated from Rotary.org data in real time.

Set a goal in each of at least 13 categories - more categories if you wish (you only need to accomplish 13).

Enter your club's accomplishments in Rotary Club Central by **June 30, 2021**. When you've achieved your goals in at least 13 categories you qualify for the Citation. **Important**: If you're counting on a Membership achievement, your membership must be sustained through June 30, 2021. A late termination or two sometimes trips clubs up.

To achieve the Citation, DG Rajamohan Munisamy has urged all Rotary Clubs in District 3310 to login to Rotary Central to enter their goals and achieve the Citation. As the goals are achievable this year, DG Rajamohan would like 100% of clubs in the District to achieve Citations by the end of the Rotary year. Achieving the Citation is not about the Presidents getting feathers in their cap but a recognition to the club as a whole for their team work and contributions, as clubs will not be able to do so without collective effort.

Significant Service Award

Recognize a club whose project has addressed a significant need in your community.

Who can nominate: club president

Nomination period: all year

Award type: electronic certificate

World Interact Week Recognition

Recognizes Interact clubs that celebrate the founding of the first club during World Interact Week, which occurs each year during the week of 5 November (from Monday to Sunday).

Who can nominate: sponsoring Rotary clubs or district Interact chairs

Nomination period: all year Award type: electronic certificate



World Rotaract Week Recognition

Recognizes Rotaract clubs that celebrate the founding of the first club during World Rotaract Week, which occurs each year during the week of 13 March (from Monday to Sunday).

Who can nominate: sponsoring Rotary clubs or district Rotaract chairs

Nomination period: all year Award type: electronic certificate

Interact Video Awards

Recognizes outstanding videos created by Interactors.

Who can nominate: Interactors or sponsor Rotary club members

Nomination period: 1 October-1 December

Award type: plaque or certificate

Rotaract Outstanding Project Awards

Recognizes Rotaract clubs that are making a sustainable impact in one of Rotary's areas of focus through their innovative community or international service projects.

Who can nominate: Rotaractors

Nomination period: 1 August-1 February

Award type: plaque or certificate

Recognize individuals

Avenues of Service Award (district recognition)

With an award from their district, clubs can honor a Rotarian or Rotaractor who participates in service activities in one of the five Avenues of Service — club, vocational, community, international, and youth service.

Who can nominate: club presidents

Nomination period: all year

Award type: electronic certificate

Rotary Foundation Distinguished Service Award

Honors individual Rotarians and Rotaractors who have demonstrated exemplary service to the Foundation and have received the Citation for Meritorious Service at least four years prior.

Who can nominate: Any Rotarian or Rotaractor Nomination period: 1 January-28/29 February

Award type: pin and crystal award



Service Award for a Polio-Free World

Honors Rotarians who have made outstanding contributions to our polio eradication efforts. Individuals can be nominated for regional or international service.

Who can nominate: Rotarians

Nomination period: Annually: July-1 October

Nomination deadline: 1 October

Award type: framed certificate, plaque

PolioPlus Pioneer Award

Honors Rotarians who provided extraordinary service to polio eradication prior to 1 November 1992.

Who can nominate: Rotarians

Nomination period: Annually: July-1 October

Nomination deadline: 1 October

Award type: crystal award

Recognize non-Rotarians

Rotary Alumni Association of the Year Award

Recognizes one outstanding alumni association each year for raising awareness of our alumni's impact on our organization.

Who can nominate: Any member of the Rotary community

Nomination period: 1 July-15 September

Award type: banner, recognition at Rotary convention

Rotary Alumni Global Service Award

Honors one outstanding Rotary alumnus each year for their humanitarian service and professional achievements.

Who can nominate: Any member of the Rotary community

Nomination period: 1 July-15 September

Award type: crystal award, recognition at the Rotary convention
