## The Road to Peace

2023-24 RI PRESIDENT R. GORDON R. MCINALLY

This month, Rotary takes a step toward supporting peacebuilding in the Middle East and North Africa region.

In November, Rotary and District 2420 are hosting a signing ceremony for our newest peace center in partnership with Bahçeşehir University in Istanbul.

The ceremony is the first in a series of events recognizing the new center at BAU and Rotary's work to promote peace. The 2024 Rotary International Convention in May will mark 25 years since the first Rotary Peace Centers were announced — coincidentally at the Rotary Convention in Singapore in 1999. Recruitment for the first cohort of Rotary Peace Fellows at BAU also starts in 2024, and selected candidates will begin their program in early 2025.

Since its beginning, the peace centers program has prepared more than 1,700 peace fellows working in more than 140 countries to create a more peaceful world. That is certainly worth celebrating, but Rotary Peace Fellows are more than statistics on a page. Their actions have helped Create Hope in the World and will continue to do so.

For example, Jennifer Montgomery and Gorett Komurembe — peace fellows from the program at Makerere University in Uganda — are co-founders of Magenta Girls Initiative. The international nongovernmental organization equips Ugandan girls and young women with the support and tools to overcome harmful gender norms, generational poverty, gender-based violence, trafficking, and trauma.

Ndzi Divine Njamsi, another peace fellow who studied at Makerere, has taken lessons learned about Positive Peace and is sharing them with students of his own in Cameroon. He became interested in the Rotary Positive Peace Activator training program after witnessing extremism, online hate speech, and violence in Cameroon. Since completing the program, he has brought his lessons on peace to students at the Yaoundé International Business School and other organizations in the Central Africa country.

The world needs more people like the graduates of the program at Makerere and our other peace fellows. To that end, we can all advance peace by encouraging our local peacebuilders to learn more about Rotary and apply for this impactful fellowship. Rotary mem? bers can also mentor candidates for the fellowship. Or you can work with peace fellows who have already graduated. They probably have an initiative or two that would benefit from your help.

Our peace centers in North America, Europe, Africa, Australia, and Asia depend on financial support as well. The program at BAU was made possible thanks to a generous gift of \$15.5 million to The Rotary Foun@dation from the Otto and Fran Walter Foundation.

This new Rotary Peace Center will offer a one-year professional development certificate in peace and development studies for fellows focusing on peacebuilding within the Middle East and North Africa region.

Peace must be waged persistently; it is the soil where hope takes root. But as with any journey, we take one step at a time. Let's take those steps together.



## **Unnatural Disasters**

In December, I will attend the United Nations COP28 climate change summit in Dubai, United Arab Emirates. There, I will speak about the convergence of two global crises: climate and mental health. As the World Health Organizatioin has noted, climate change worsens risk factors -- such as disruptions to homes and livelihoods -- for mental health problems. The emotional distress of a disaster also makes it difficult for people to recover and rebuild.

Rotary partner ShelterBox is an international disaster relief charity that has helped more than 2.5 million displaced people in approximately 100 countries with emergency shelter, essential household items, and technical support. I wish to share this month's column with their CEO, Sanj Srikanthan, who explains that the words we choose to describe disasters matter.

The term "natural" disaster has long been used to describe tropoical storms, floods, earthquakes, and volcanic eruptions, but there needs to be an urgent shift in the language we use. While the term may seem harmless, and we've not always gotten it right, we've learned through our work with disaster-affected communities how it perpetuates a dangerous myth that nothing could have been done to prevent people being so badly affected. This misleading and harmful narrative can lead to a lack of action to help people who need it.

The language we use matters. When we frame disasters as natural, we fail to acknowledge the complex interplay between nature and the role of human actions and how they impact communities around the world.

Earthquakes, tsunamis, volcanic eruptions, and extreme storms, drought, and flooding occur because of natural processes on Earth. But it is how these events affect people or the environment that has the potential to make them a disaster -- outcomes influenced by human factors like where people live, what types of homes they have, political instability, and the lack of proactive measures to protect vulnerable communities. A disaster is the result of systemic inequalities in access to resources and power. Where we live and how much money we have often determines our ability to recover. The people worst affected are

those living in poverty, with the least means to protect themselves and few resources to withstand the next event.

By framing these events as natural, we undermine the need for proactive measures to protect vulnerable communities, masking the underlying social, economic, and political instability that makes marginalized and disadvantaged communities disproportionately affected. Our teams see firsthand how issues like inequality, poverty, urbanization, deforestation, and the climate crisis can make communities more vulnerable.

At ShelterBox, we simply say "disaster" or are more specific, describing the extreme weather, earthquake, tsunami, or volcanic eruption. I urge everyone to help us in breaking this cycle by committing to language that accurately reflects why people are affected so badly.

Only then does it pave the way to address the underlying causes of vulnerability and work toward a more just and equitable future for all, with the necessary invesment, resources, and proactive measures to help protect affected communities.

Disasters are not natural. Let's stop saying they are.



## SOCIO-MEDICAL OUTREACH BY ROTARY CLUB OF KOTA KINABALU SOUTH











The Rotary Club of Kota Kinabalu South led by President Carlwin Yee and his committee carried out a Socio-Medical outreach to Kampung Miruru, a remote kampung in the district of Ranau, 182 kilometers from Kota Kinabalu, Sabah. This meaningful project was organised by our senior Rotarian and Past President Datuk Dr. Ganesh. A total of over 147 primary school students and over 300 local residents have benefited.

Rotary Club of Kota Kinabalu South carries out two (2) Socio- Medical Outreach to the remote areas in Sabah each year. This has been one of the Club's community projects for the past 25 years. The Club completed one successful Medical Outreach earlier this year on 30th April 2023 in Kampung Pagalungan, District of Nabawan, Sabah.

The Socio Medical Outreach initiative covers a range of general health checks from eyesight, glucose levels, blood pressure readings, dental checks with extractions and BMI readings.

Rotarian Datuk Dr. Ganesh together with four (4) other medical officers completed 104 medical check-ups. Rotarian Lie Kien Yueng (Optometrist) conducted 90 eye check-ups and gave out 72 reading glasses for those with far sightedness. Five dental officers from Klinik Kesihatan Paginathan and Ranau performed 65 dental inspections and completed 50 tooth extractions.

Deworming tablets were taken by 180 children and teenagers on the spot as part of the campaign to improve the overall health of the community in Kampung Miruru, Campaigns were conducted at the same time for blood donations, organ donations and dental health awareness targeted for children in the village in order to improve dental health and encourage good hygiene practices.

This event would not have been successful without the efforts of a collaborative team in planning, organising and implementation on the day itself. Those involved were 15 Rotarians from the Rotary Club of Kota Kinabalu South along with 9 volunteers from Kota Kinabalu, 2 Pharmacists, 4 Medical Officers, 5 dental staff, 8 from the blood donation campaign team, 3 from the organ donation campaign team including 21 volunteers from Hospital Ranau and Klinik Kesihatan Paginatan.



The Chinese Music Concert "Music for You" organised by the Rotary Club of Kuching South was successfully held on 18 November 2023. The night was embraced with love and warm atmosphere, with more than five hundred audiences. The event was aimed to raise funds for the building of a baking classroom for Chung Hua Middle School No. 3, donation of groceries to the needy and many other meaningful projects. Rotary Club of Kuching South has always strive to provide help in times of needs.

The club wished to thank all of the guests who have volunteered in the performance and they are mainly the teachers and students from Shangyin Music School in Kuching, Zhang Chuhe, a famous suona teacher and performer from Singapore, Bellamos Music Center and St. Joseph Private Secondary School Kuching's teachers and students.

President Bong Joon Hin mentioned in his speech that there are many perception that Rotary is a western organisation thus preventing many Chinese speaking community from joining. He added that The Rotary Club of Kuching South is a Chinese speaking club in Kuching and has been maintaining interaction and needs of the Chinese community in Sarawak.

The event was officiated by District Governor Dr. John Chan and during his speech, he encouraged the Chinese speaking Rotary clubs in Sarawak to continue strengthening relationship with the Chinese community. He acknowledged the effort by Rotary Club of Kuching South for encouraging many Chinese community leaders to join Rotary. District Governor Dr. John Chan emphasised that all of the funds raised by Rotary is for the community service projects.

The main objective of organising the concert is to raise funds for Wishesland Malaysia, an NGO founded in 2009 by a group of individual and parents with children diagnosed with cerebral palsy, a condition that affect movement and posture caused by damage that occurs to the developing brain.

Wishesland is planning to recruit more physiotherapists to offer better care to these children.



## Rotary Club of Singapore -Help The Children Project 2023

Rotary Club of Singapore with its signature Help the Children Project for the year 2024 with a Project visit to the city of Malang and Batu in East Java, Indonesia from 1 - 3 September 2023.

The delegation of 65 Rotarians and Family Members was led by RC Singapore's President Dr. Chan Siew Luen and included Rotarians from



Singapore, Malaysia, Philippines and Australia. We were also to include DGE JSC from D3490, Taiwan and 7 members of hid District's World Community Service as part of our delegation.

The project provided each student with school going items including books, stationery, shoes and school uniforms from 20 elementary schools. The poorest 25 students from each school as recommended by the school's principals received the benefits worth USD\$125 per student. To qualify for assistance, the student's household income should not exceed USD\$30 per month. For this year, a total of 525 such students received assistance. The project also received support for the local Mayor's office and ministries.

In addition, the delegation also made our annual visit to Bhakti Luhur Orphanage in Malang. This orphanage is the largest in East Java with estimated 350 residents and 150 staff members. RC Singapore has been providing assistance for the Orphanage for the past 13 years. This included with several Global Grants and financial, food and medication assistance in cooperation with Ishk Tolaram Foundation.

At the close of the visit, RC Singapore agreed to continue assisting the community in Malang and Batu with several more Global Grants in the pipeline. We are also grateful to our Honorary Member, Rtn Mohan Vaswani and his spouse Kawita for graciously hosting the delegation throughout our stay and visit to Malang and Batu. We are already looking forward to the 2024 edition of Help the Children Project.

The grant's planners submit the application to The Rotary Foundation


#### **Approved**






