




### Interact Leadership Training Camp (ILTC) 2025 in various regions








#### **District Rotaract Committee**

### Eye Screening at SJK (T) Gelang Patah

### **Eye Screening at SK Desa Skudai**

The Rotary Club of Pasir Gudang organised an eye screening event for almost 300 students of SK Desa Skudai on the 11th of September. The cost of providing free spectacles for the B40 students required glasses was shared together with OO United Optical Holdings Sdn Bhd. The club also worked together with the school's PIBG to share with the students methods of preventing eye disease and how to protect their eyes.

















### Secondary School Children Welfare Support

RCBPM recently launched a Secondary School Student Aid Program. With funding support from DTA Johor Melaka Fund, the club secured RM10,000 to aid 50 underprivileged secondary school students. Each student received a package comprising essential stationery worth RM205 and cash vouchers for school supplies as well as groceries, ensuring they have the basic tools and resources to continue their education with dignity.

The fund distribution was carried out at our club in Batu Pahat. The initiative reflects Rotary's commitment to supporting education, uplifting disadvantaged families, and ensuring equitable access to learning opportunities. By leveraging such funding, the club consistently channels resources back into the community, especially toward youth education support.

Club President Giolee expressed gratitude to school teachers for helping to identify deserving students and emphasized that education is a crucial pathway for breaking the cycle of poverty. This initiative underscores the Rotary's mission of serving the community through sustainable and impactful projects.

### Walk To End Polio 2025 RCKK Pearl Flag Off

On 27 July 2025, the Rotary Club of Kota Kinabalu Pearl, together with nine Rotary and Inner Wheel Clubs in Kota Kinabalu, organised the "Walk to End Polio 2025" at Anjung Selera, Tanjung Lipat. This initiative was part of Rotary District 3310's regional campaign, led by District Governor Dr Shahul Hameed, to raise awareness and support for the global eradication of polio.

Participating clubs included RC Likas Bay, RC Kota Kinabalu, RC Tanjung Aru, RC South, RC Sutera, RC Luyang, RC Penampang, RC Mandarin, and the Inner Wheel Club. The event began with an energetic Zumba session led by Jamitah Jainin and her team, followed by a community walk symbolising unity for a polio-free world.

Special thanks to IPP Chendramata for preparing nasi lemak, President Datin Dr Jeanette Tambakau for sponsoring the meal, Past President Rosie Chong for providing mineral water, and Pamela for the celebratory cake. Interactors from SMK Likas & SMK Perempuan and Rotractor of UNITAR KK College also joined, reflecting the strong youth commitment to service.

With polio cases reduced by over 99.9% in the last 35 years, Rotary remains committed to finishing the fight — ensuring no child suffers from polio again.













# Sipitang Cataract Camp Bringing Clearer Vision to the Community

On 10 August 2025, the Rotary Club of Kota Kinabalu Mandarin (RCKKM) proudly led the Sipitang Cataract Camp at SMK Pengiran Omar 2, uniting service and compassion to bring the gift of sight to those in need.

This impactful event had received a good response with:

- 172 villagers registered for eye screening
- 43 patients referred for further cataract treatment
- 134 reading glasses distributed to improve daily vision

The success of this meaningful project was made possible by the dedication of almost 70 volunteers, including Rotarians and spouses, whose time, skills, and warm hearts ensured everything ran smoothly.

Beyond cataract screening, the camp also expanded healthcare access through a collaboration with PEKA B40, offering free blood testing to the public. Sipitang Hospital also supported the event by providing dental services from 8:30 AM to 12:30 PM, promoting oral health awareness.

Most importantly, this Sipitang Cataract Camp was a joint project participated by 9 Rotary Clubs of Kota Kinabalu under the Gift of Sight 3.0 initiative — a true testament to Rotary's spirit of collaboration and service.

Thank you all for making a difference together, we Unite for Good — not just providing clearer vision, but also brighter smiles and healthier lives to the Sipitang community.











### **Ibu Sejahtera Seminar**

The Rotary Club of Kota Kinabalu Pearl, in collaboration with the Sabah Women's Affairs Department (JHEWA), successfully hosted the Ibu Sejahtera: Pendekatan Holistik untuk Ibu Muda program on 13 August 2025 at Zara Boutique Hotel, Kota Kinabalu, with a hybrid format reaching participants across Sabah.

This meaningful initiative aimed to empower young mothers with essential knowledge on reproductive health, baby care, breastfeeding and nutrition, and emotional well-being through expert-led sessions by Universiti Malaysia Sabah, Sabah Nurses Association, Quality Confinement Home, and Hospital Wanita & Kanak-Kanak Likas.

The program directly benefited 100 young mothers, both in-person and online, providing them not only with valuable skills but also free health screenings, including blood pressure, glucose, urine tests, and counselling, sponsored by Borneo Sinarmas. Participants also received Vitamin C supplements sponsored by Vita Health.

Special thanks to Zara Boutique Hotel for venue sponsorship and to programme chairperson IPP OC Pn Chendramata Sinteh, the organising committee, and our dedicated Pearl members for making the event a success.

The Ibu Sejahtera program reflects our club's commitment to supporting maternal health and building a strong network of care, ensuring no mother feels alone in her parenting journey.











## Flowing Forward: RCKK Pearl's most significant WASH Impact to Date

#### **RC Kota Kinabalu Pearl**

In Rotary Year 2024–2025, the Rotary Club of Kota Kinabalu Pearl and partners delivered its most extensive WASH (Water, Sanitation & Hygiene) impact yet — providing access to clean, sustainable water for 1,708 families (7,699 individuals) across 17 rural villages in Sabah.

Spanning the districts of Ranau, Kota Belud, Kiulu, and Pitas, this RM710,000 initiative was made possible through the generous support of The Malaysian Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, and in collaboration with:

- RC Likas Bay
- RC Bandar Seri Begawan (Brunei)
- RC Changi (Singapore)
- Pertubuhan Komuniti Elite (Kuala Lumpur)

From May to June 2025, 16 launching ceremonies were held to mark the start of life with clean water — a first for many of these remote communities. Since 2019, RCKK Pearl's WASH programme has expanded to 38 villages in six districts, impacting over 15,800 rural individuals, with cumulative project value exceeding RM1.53 million.

"This year's work marks our most extensive coverage to date. We're not just installing water systems — we're restoring dignity, improving health, and empowering generations," said the WASH Chair for RCKK Pearl.

Together, we unite for good and move forward with a purpose.

### Gift of Sight Project - Bau

Our club members, led by President Pauline Pui and Prevention of Blindness Chair PP Chai Ko Jee, handed out goodie bags to the patients. Throughout this session, our club's contingent got to communicate with the local residents, emphasising the importance of maintaining good eye health and listening to their concerns. The success of this recent outing has affirmed our club's commitment in the prevention of blindness and our aim this Rotary Year to Unite For Good.













# **Kuching City Cup - Charity Pickleball Competition**

On August 9, 2025, the Rotary Club of Kuching Central successfully hosted the Kuching City Cup at Pikabol Kuching, bringing together 192 adult and 62 youth pickleball players in a day of competitive sport for a worthy cause. Organized in collaboration with the P195 Bandar Kuching parliament constituency service center, Kuching Pickleball Association, and Vibrance Pickleball Group, the tournament aimed to promote pickleball among Bandar Kuching residents while raising funds for the Rotary Club's humanitarian projects.

The competition, officiated by Guest of Honour Yang Berhormat Dr. Kelvin Yii (Member of Parliament for P195 Bandar Kuching), featured multiple categories including team events with 16 competing teams, novice doubles with 32 pairs, and a well-received youth tournament that attracted participants from as far as Betong. With generous support from sponsors F&N Sarawak, Khong Guan, and Shine Pharmacy, the event distributed RM15,000 in prizes and goodies while successfully raising over RM50,000 to support the Rotary Club of Kuching Central's ongoing humanitarian efforts. I met Jarred, now 31 years old, a recipient of our 138th global grant in July 2024. We are the partner club of RC Makati Central for renal transplants for indigent patients in Philippines.

Before the surgery he was on dialysis for 2 years and 7 months, he deactivated his social media, he feels there was no future for him anymore. He is preparing for the worst.

Today, beaming with pride, he told me "Thank you Rotary, you gave me hope, I can dream again, I am back at work making it happen and I have a future'. The Beneficiary and the Primary Contact of the Global Grant in one meeting, enjoying a meal together.

The gift of Rotary, and the gift of giving back. It's a beautiful reminder of why we do what we do, we are here for good... for good.
